Dear Katy Elementary Parents, Guardians and Community,

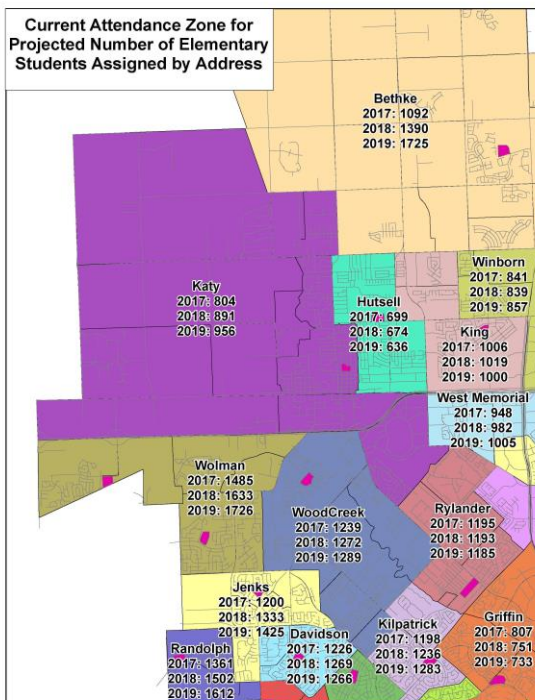
As you may already know, Katy ISD will be opening its 40th elementary school for the 2017-2018 school year.

During the Work Study meeting yesterday, the Board of Trustees discussed attendance boundary modifications (ABMs) to help balance enrollment and provide relief to certain schools that are considered overcrowded at this time. **Wolman Elementary School** and **Katy Elementary School** are currently being considered for attendance boundary modifications in preparation for the opening of Bryant Elementary School in the fall of 2017.

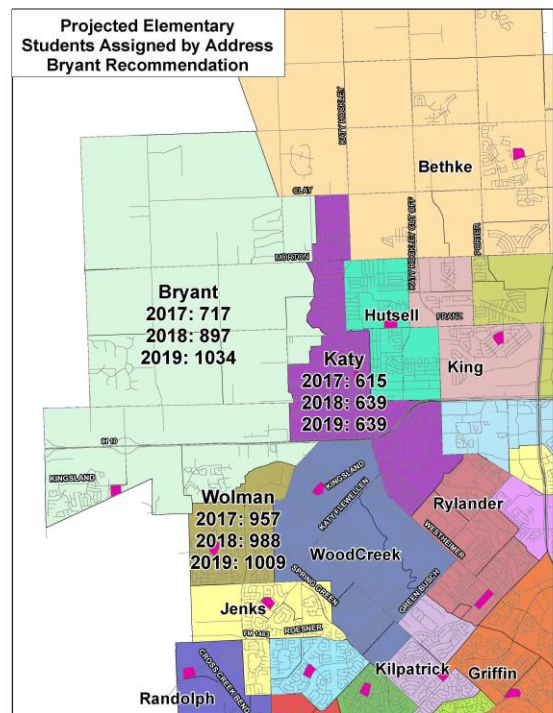
In an effort to gather feedback from the public on ABM discussions, a community survey will be sent and made available from November 15 – 30. The survey will be sent via e-mail, posted [online](#) and available in hard copies at our campus.

With this proposed ABM, our school's annual enrollment will decrease to approximately 615 students in the 2017-18 school year.
