
Students of the Month Selected For December and January

New Year, New Opportunities by Dr. Brian Maher, Superintendent



While I have already had many detailed conversations with the Governor's Of-

fice since taking the job as your superintendent six months ago and I've met with literally dozens of lawmakers from across the state, the real work and promise for the future begins during the legislative session.

As the largest school district in South Dakota, the Sioux Falls School District will take our role of involvement in the legislative process very seriously. Because we are educating and encouraging each of our 24,000 students to be informed, active citizens in their communities, so too must we be informed and active in all education-related topics presented for consideration by lawmakers.

Over the years, the District has "fine-tuned" its process for participation. Not only do we have a lobbyist who is on the Capitol floor throughout the session to advocate on behalf of public school students and teachers, but we invest a considerable amount of time researching and making recommendations about proposed bills.

We track every education-related bill from inception to completion. When necessary, we are on the phone with legislators. We drive to Pierre for meetings and testimony. We develop position statements and discuss those at school board meetings throughout the legislative session. In short – we are involved!

Of primary concern for South Dakota schools this year is finding new money to support education into the future. Schools are continually challenged with recruiting and retaining high quality teachers because they are often lured away by higher salaries in the private sector. Teachers will never "get rich" in South Dakota, but our hope is that a plan will develop that ensures a livable wage for those who dedicate their lives to educating our children.

I approach this legislative session with great optimism. I know there is a great amount of work to get done. But, I feel there also exists a great opportunity to positively impact education in our state this legislative session. That positive impact could last for many years to come...what an opportunity!

January is a new beginning, a new opportunity, a clean slate. I look forward to all of the conversations and ideas that will lead us in to 2016 and lead our students into a bright future.





Registration for the May 2016 AP Exams and AP Scholarships

It is time again for LHS students enrolled in AP classes and AP on-line courses to begin to plan for the May 2016 AP exams. The AP exams will be given May 2 through May 13. Students will receive the registration information and the 2016 AP Bulletin for AP Students and Parents in their AP classes during the second week of February. This publication includes the schedule for the exams, an explanation of how the exams are scored by College Board, and score reporting. Additional information on the Advanced Placement program, exams, and on-line resources for students can be found on-line and resources for students can be found on-line by going to AP Central.

This year students will register for the May 2016 Advanced Placement exams on-line by going to Total Registration, www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/421178. Students will need a working email address in order to register. When filling out the registration form be sure to select all your exams and teachers and double check all of your information on the preview page. You will not be able to come back and edit this registration at a later date.

- If everything is correct, click "Register". This will record your registration and display the confirmation page.
- When you reach the confirmation page, print one copy for your records and one copy for each of the tests that your student will be taking.

If you need to make changes to the registration you must see Mr. Morrison in E220.

Payment:

The cost for each exam is \$92 and may be paid for with a check, money order or cash. The payment for the exam must be attached to a copy of your confirmation of registration.

- Payment by check: Use two checks for each exam
 one for \$15 and one for \$77. The checks should be made payable to Lincoln High School.
- Payment by money order: Use a single money order for \$92 per test and make it payable to Lincoln High School.
- Your confirmation and payment must be returned to your AP classroom instructor before 3:30 pm on Friday March 15, 2016. Your registration is not complete until payment is made and no tests will be ordered without payment.

Refund policy:

Students who order an exam and decide not to take that exam will receive a refund of \$77. The \$15 check covers the cost of ordering and returning unused exams. The deadline for refunds is June 1, 2016.

Important Dates:

February 11, 2016 – 8 am – registration at Total Registration website begins

March 11, 2016 - 8 pm - online registration closes.

March 15, 2016 – payment and registration information due in your AP classes

After March 11th students must see Mr. Morrison in E220 to make any changes in their registration for exams.


AP Scholarships and Financial Aid

Preparations for the Advanced Placement tests have begun at Lincoln High School. Student registration will begin in February and the tests will be offered in May. We encourage parents and students to begin preparations as well, including financial preparations. Each test will cost \$92 this year. Unfortunately, due to financial constraints, we will only be able to guarantee financial assistance for those who have qualified for free and reduced lunch.

While many AP students do not consistently eat lunch at school, free and reduced lunch qualifications may allow for financial assistance for not only AP tests but also the ACT, SAT and college application fees. Students and parents have access to free and reduced lunch applications online at http://www.schoollunchapp.com/. **Applications are due by February 28, 2016** to qualify for the May AP tests. If you have any questions please contact Mr. Morrison by phone or at adam.morrison@k12.sd.us.

Limited financial aid also exists for students who do not qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch, although students who are taking multiple exams will have precedence. Anyone interested must see Mr. Morrison in E220 to get information and forms for applying for assistance. You should complete the application prior to registering for exams.
