News From the Gym



Welcome to Jefferson's Physical Education (P.E.) specialist class! I'm Ms. Rowe, your child's P.E. teacher. I'm very excited to welcome former students back as well as welcome students who are new to our school!

As you may know, students do much more than 'play games' in P.E. They learn and refine skills in safe movement, motor skills, fitness, physical health, emotional health & wellness, as well as social development, cooperation, and sportsmanship. Learning in PE will take place through tons of movement in fun, engaging activities, games, stations, and cooperative work.

For your child to be successful and participate fully during PE, please help them to remember to wear athletic shoes to move safely in the gym. It might be helpful to keep a backup pair of gym shoes in your child's backpack. It is also extremely helpful if your child can tie their shoes. Shoe-tying is an important life skill that can be challenging and frustrating to many children of all ages. Knowing how to tie shoes improves a child's safety, builds their confidence and independence. Children typically learn to tie their shoes around age 6. If your child does not yet know how to tie their shoes, then it's a great time to practice! There are some great visual, step-by-step resources online. For example, on Youtube "How to Tie Your Shoes Using The Circle Technique" by 'wikiHow', or "Teach Your Kids to Tie Shoes Without Tears!" by 'The Intentional Mom', are two great videos showing kid-friendly methods to tying shoes. Click these links or do your own search. Hopefully, with a little time and practice, your child will become a shoe-tying expert!

Big changes with school meals for 2022-23



There are big changes happening with school meals for the 2022-23 school year that are important for you to understand. As we continue to return to 'normal,' the USDA is no longer able to extend the 'free meals for all' waiver we have appreciated the last two school years.

However, our state recently passed a new bill that eases the transition, called the Community Eligibility Provision, or CEP for short. CEP is a free meal service option for schools and school districts who have a 40 percent or higher number of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Everett Public Schools worked hard to group the largest number of schools possible that kept the average percentage above the program threshold and because of this, 18 of our schools qualify for this program, including our school.

This means that breakfast and lunches are free to all students at these schools, regardless of free and reduced lunch qualifications. Families at these schools will fill out a household income report, which has been emailed directly to you, in place of the free and reduced lunch application. This report is important to provide students access to free waivers and other services.




We are so excited to be able to use this new program to offer free meals to the students in our district who may need some extra support and to all of our students, no matter where they learn, we will continue to offer nutritious and delicious meals that include seasonal fresh fruits and vegetables, scratch-made whole grain foods and lean proteins, with vegetarian and gluten free options too. There has never been a better time to eat school meals. We look forward to serving you soon.

Community Transit free to youth 18 and under

Starting September 1, youth 18 and under can ride all Community Transit services for free. That includes buses, DART paratransit service and vanpools (if they belong to a vanpool). Teens aged 13-18 are strongly encouraged to get a Youth ORCA card to use for fare "payment." Community Transit will be providing them at our high schools before school starts and middle schools when they get further shipments. For more information visit <u>Youth Fares</u> Community Transit.

Washington Comprehenisve Assessment of Science scores will be released in September. They will be put in HAC as soon as they arrive, and Individual Student Score Reports will be sent home through the normal school channels.

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry visit, sign up for <u>MyIR</u> to view, download and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare and camp programs.

ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2022-23

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families.

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. We have both school-day classroom schedules and half-day (AM and PM) classroom schedules, depending on the school location. Space is limited – apply early! Kids in Transition program



Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify for two federal programs which provide support for children and youth whose housing is highly mobile: those who meet the more inclusive definition of homeless under the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Act and those who are eligible for Foster Care Education support.

Students who are in foster care placement (where a child welfare agency has placement, care and authority) or those who are without a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence may qualify for this additional support.

The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure eligible students have access to free school meals, school supplies and uniforms. KIT may help students access extended day or summer school classes or coordinate access to additional academic support or tutoring when needed. The KIT Program may also cover, or coordinate waivers for, fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT can also help set up transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible and in the best interest of the student. We also partner with the Family Resource Center and other community agencies to connect families and students to resources as needed.

Last year, Everett Public Schools served over 1,350 students through our KIT support at some time during the school year. For more information, visit www.everettsd.org/KIT to learn who your school's KIT support staff is; or contact the KIT Office at 425-385-4032.


Students in need of a backpack, please reach out to your school to receive your supplies. Backpacks are available for pick up at each school.
