#### **ILEARN Results**

You may have read in the paper, or seen on the news, that results from last year's Indiana State Assessment, ILEARN, were recently released (to a certain degree). Across the state, schools have seen a decrease in scores with this new assessment. In fact, the assessment has changed multiple times over the last ten years, and each time, schools across the state have seen a decrease in scores. While the assessment is designed to measure student growth, this is difficult to do accurately when so many changes are taking place. This assessment is a snapshot of just a few days out of the 180 days that we work with your children.

University School performed well above the state average in ELA and Math, yet a number does not encompass everything that we do at University School. We will continue to provide exceptional instruction to your children while fostering a safe and healthy learning environment.

## September Lifeline and Learner Profile

For the month of September, we will focus on the Lifeline of "Cooperation" and the Learner Profile of "Knowledgeable."

- **Cooperation**: "We listen to the thoughts and ideas of others."
- *Knowledgeable*: "We explore ideas and issues that are important to us, our community, and our world."

Each month, teachers will nominate students from their classrooms that model these traits. Students will have their pictures taken and placed on the large bulletin board outside the gym where we hope to have a collage of our students by the end of the year.
