#### **Student Absences**

Parents are asked to telephone the school prior to 9:00 a.m. when a child is absent for any reason. We have an answering machine, so you can leave your child's name, teacher, and the reason for the absence. You can also send an email to <a href="mailto:CSESabsence@mcpsmd.org">CSESabsence@mcpsmd.org</a>. The child must bring a note from home upon his/her return. Parents should keep children at home when illness is suspected, a communicable disease has been diagnosed or lice nits have been found. After five consecutive days of absences, a physician's note is required.

### Absence Policy

- AM absent, if they arrive more than 2 hours late
- PM absent, if they leave more than 2 hours early
- If they are absent for more than any 2 hours during the school day, it's considered a ½ day absence
- If they are present for less than 2 hours of the entire school day, it's considered a full day absence

Late arrivals - Please make sure to escort your child/children into the building and sign them in if you are late to school for any reason. Our attendance secretary Ms. Okoroha, will be happy to help you as you signin with anything you may need.



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#### **Grade Level School Supplies**

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#### **Visitors and Volunteers**

Parent and community volunteers may return to Cold Spring Elementary School to support in-person instruction, activities, and special events as the schools deem appropriate or necessary. We appreciate the time and efforts that parents, families, and community members spend to engage in volunteer activities in our school, from kindergarten to fifth grade, and welcome this partnership with teaching and learning.

### **Arrival and Dismissal Procedures**

**Students are welcome to play on the blacktop from 8:40 - 8:53 am.** There will be a staff member and student patrols supervising during this time. Students will line up by class and then enter the building at 8:55am. See map pictured below for entrance locations. All locations will be clearly labeled for students and families.

- **Kindergarten Students:** Kindergarten students will enter at the kindergarten entrance and go directly to their classroom.
- 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Grade Students: Students will enter at the GYM entrance and go directly to their classroom.
- 4th & 5th Grade Students: Students will enter the main entrance and go directly to their classroom.
- Bus Riders: Students will enter the main entrance and go directly to their classroom.
- Car Riders: Please utilize the car rider loop and drive all the way to the end. A staff member will be there to greet your child as they enter the building. View our Cold Spring "Rules of the Road."
  - o Please pull up as far as you can and always move forward to close any gaps.
  - o While waiting on the carpool line, please do not block the crosswalk.



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- Please remain with your vehicle!
- o Once you have dropped-off or picked-up your child safely, please pull out of the lane promptly so that other cars can move forward.





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Dismissal will begin at 3:25pm. If dismissal plans have changed for your child/children, (play date, child care changes), all changes **must** be made in writing/email to the main office attention Ms. Okoroha <u>Cyrina I Okoroha@mcpsmd.org</u> by 3:00pm. Please state your child's name, the name of the individual they should be dismissed with, and your signature. We appreciate when you send this to your child/children's teacher as well, however, to ensure dismissal plans are noted, please send directly to Ms. Okoroha. In the event of last minute changes to a student's dismissal plans, please call the main office.

Any adult who comes to school to pick up a child will be asked to show documentation to verify identification and ensure student safety.

### Kindergarten Dismissal Procedure

Kindergarten students will be dismissed from the Kindergarten doors. Please pick up your kindergartener at this location where they will be waiting with their teacher.

### **Walkers and Bicyclists**

- Please do not congregate and talk after you have picked up your child.
- Bicyclists are asked to walk their bicycles once they are on school property.

### **Bus Rider Information**

Bus information from the MCPS Transportation Office is outlined at the below website and arrival and departure routes for our community students are located below. Families should also be aware that road construction, poor weather conditions, and accidents are real traffic stoppers in the Potomac area, so buses may be legitimately delayed when picking up students in the mornings. 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#### **Bus Rider Safety**

To ensure your child's safe return from school on the bus, please meet him/her at the bus stop. We stress the importance of a parent or other responsible adult being at the stop to receive the child or make other arrangements for your child to get from the stop to the home safely. In the event you or your designee are running late or are otherwise unable to get to the bus stop, you should call the school early enough to have your child held at the school for pick-up rather than put on the bus. Families are encouraged to keep the school's phone number in their cell phone (or with them) so you can make a call like this quickly.

According to the Department of Transportation, bus operators will let **all** children off at the bus stop, including kindergarten and first grade students, even if there is no adult there to greet the child. When the bus pulls up and many students get off, there is no one-to-one matching of students to parents. Please understand that safe student transportation is a joint responsibility. Please remind your child to look for you before leaving the bus. We look forward to a safe and successful school year.

### Breakfast & Lunch

MCPS will resume regular meal services during the 2022-2023 school year.

Meal prices: Breakfast - \$1.30; Lunch - \$2.25 (Elementary); \$2.80 (Middle and High)

Beginning this year, students in Maryland who qualify for reduced price meals will not be charged for breakfast or lunch meals.

#### FREE & REDUCED-PRICE MEAL APPLICATIONS

Families who meet certain federal income standards are eligible for free or reduced-priced meal benefits. All children use their MCPS ID number at the register so confidentiality is maintained, and no child is overtly identified as receiving free or reduced-price meals. Only one application is needed for all students in a household.

This powerful quote from Maya Angelou encapsulates our attitude on continuous learning as educators. Our Cold Spring staff has engaged all summer in literacy and mathematics training. We are excited to share the new shifts in curriculum and even more excited to transfer our learning into practice with your children.

### **Literacy Shifts:**


As we begin the school year, Montgomery County will shift their literacy approach for kindergarten through second grade students to a more explicit and intentional focus called *Structured Literacy*. This researched based approach will support your students' building of a strong literacy foundation in phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. The below diagram demonstrates how this approach builds the most skilled readers.



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We are also pleased to share that we will be **piloting** the *Enriched Literacy Curriculum (ELC)* in fourth and fifth grade for all students this year. The ELC provides instructional opportunities with complex literary and informational texts, writing instruction based on developing the writer through the writing process and writing workshop, and establishes an instructional atmosphere that promotes critical and creative thinking. The curriculum uses best practices in gifted education research and incorporates components of supplemental programs including: Jacob's Ladder Reading Comprehension Program, Junior Great Books, William and Mary Language Arts Units, and Lucy Calkins Unit of Study in Writing.

#### **Math Shifts:**

We are eager to build time for small group instruction in our Eureka Math blocks this school year. Students will be engaged in the same components of Eureka Math (fluency, concept development, application problem, student



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debrief) and our teachers will be intentionally planning to meet students needs better with small group instruction. We will also be focusing on incorporating enrichment into every Eureka math class.

We are eager to share more information on the above literacy and math changes with our community this year!
