- Class schedules are mostly complete and all class schedule changes will completed by September 4. Only level changes will be considered after this time. If you have any questions or concerns about your schedule, please contact your counselor. A huge thank you to Mr. Bjorkman and his guidance staff for their diligent efforts to accommodate the numerous schedule requests they received and the balancing of classes. Great Job!!
- Seniors, If you are applying for Early Graduation or Exception to the Full Day(Term 1) your forms need to be submitted by Wednesday, September 9. The forms to apply are under Counseling on the FHS Website. Verification letters would then need to be emailed to your counselor.
- Attendance during Virtual Learning: The Virginia Department of Education requires schools to \geq maintain attendance records for both synchronous and asynchronous days of instruction. Synchronous day attendance is easily done since teachers and students have direct contact. Teachers simply indicate which students were in attendance during this time. Asynchronous day attendance is more difficult since this contact may or may not take place. We understand this is a very different and stressful time for students, parents and teachers and we are making every effort to make this process as easy as possible for all involved. To maintain accurate attendance records on asynchronous days of instruction, students are typically completing assignments, projects, group discussions and other instructional activities individually or in groups. Students are not expected to log on to each class on asynchronous days and/or spend the 80 minute block involved in instruction. Something as simple as submitting an assignment, asking a question, logging in for help, or other easy process the teacher develops are sufficient to determine student engagement. Students will be counted present if they are engaged in some form. Again, simplicity is our goal. Wednesdays are days for office hours and attendance is not "taken" and will default to present. I am encouraging teachers to be flexible and work with students and parents to make this work. We would like to try this method for a brief time to gauge its success and we may need to make modifications as necessary. If you have any questions or concerns about the attendance process, please contact the Attendance Office or Administration.

Notes: Should students not be available at the actual time of the lesson due to connectivity problems or other circumstances, the student can complete the lesson through alternate means and will be marked present **once the parent notifies the teacher that the lesson has been completed.** Additionally, students who complete or attempt to complete assignments on asynchronous days will be counted present for that day/class. When students are absent from classes, parents must contact the attendance office to excuse this absence.

- SAT and ACT Tests: Because of the uncertainty of the pandemic and the concerns for the health and safety of our students and staff, the SAT and ACT testing scheduled at Fauquier High School for the months of August through December have been cancelled. We will continue to monitor the local conditions and reassess the testing schedule in January. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. Update: The staff at FHS is working on a mitigation plan in an effort to offer SAT and ACT testing at FHS in October, November, and December to address the health and safety of our students and staff. Stay tuned for more information.
- A reminder to parents and students that personal items left at school at the end of the 2019-20 school year, in lockers and locker rooms are still available for pick-up in the Main Office. If you have any such items, please contact the Main Office at 540-422-7300.
- Blackboard pages are becoming uniform! I have received many comments in the last few months from parents that teacher blackboard pages were difficult to navigate and to find information in specific places. We heard you! Beginning this year, all teachers will be using a template that places information in the same place for ease of use. There will be designated sections for assignments, grades, class procedures, teacher communication and more with the option for additional links to supplemental information. This should allow parents to view the blackboard pages for teachers and easily find the same information in the same location on the page. I look forward to any comments you may have on the new set-up.
- VHSL News- VHSL is currently reviewing the status of sports and other activities for upcoming school year. We are hopeful to have more definite information on schedules, facility use, and student programs soon. We will keep you informed.
- Falcon Booster Club: The Falcon Booster Club continues to work hard to provide our student athletes with scholarships, equipment, and numerous opportunities to assist in their academic and athletic endeavors. They are looking for interested individuals who would also like to assist in this cause. If interested, please contact the school or activities director for information on the organization, membership application and meeting times.
- Underclassmen Pictures: We are currently working with Victor O'Neill Studios to develop a calendar hopefully in the months of September and/or October to schedule underclassmen pictures. We will use a system similar to the one used for Senior Portraits where a notification will be sent to students and parents with a link provided to select an appointment time. Additional information coming soon.

FUTURE FOCUS

SENIORS: MAKE DECISIONS

Most jobs require some kind of education or training beyond high school. This can mean a trade school, apprenticeship, certificate program, military service, associate's degree, as well as a traditional bachelor's degree. Encourage your student to explore all the options that interest them and then do these two things right now to successfully plan for the future:

Do your research. Exploring options will take a little more work this fall. Search the Virginia Job Outlook for a list of high demand careers by level of education. Use the college search feature at bigfuture.org, attend a virtual college fair, or connect remotely with an admissions officer to build a list of potential programs. Important things to consider: program quality, majors, costs and available scholarships.

Control what you can. You can't control whether your child will be able to take the SAT/ACT, but you can help them prepare a strong application package, which includes an excellent academic resume, well-written essay, and solid letters of recommendation.

JUNIORS: EXPLORE OPTIONS

A well-rounded application starts before senior year. Encourage your student to find creative ways to serve as a student leader through clubs, sports teams, or volunteering. These roles develop confidence, responsibility, time management, and communication skills. Working with others to solve problems and develop plans is a great way to build the skills to succeed in college and the workforce.

SOPHOMORES: GET EXPERIENCE

This year students should focus on learning more about possible career choices. Ask people about their typical day, work/life balance, and what's most challenging and rewarding about their job. These "informational interviews" are a great way to find out what a job is really like and to sharpen communication skills.

FRESHMEN: KNOW YOURSELF

People who don't pursue their interests and values don't do as well in school or at work. But not every career ties neatly to a school subject. Encourage your student to consider interests they have both inside and outside the classroom as career areas to explore.

In Observance of World Suicide Prevention Day September 10^{th -}

The Counseling Department wants to share the following helpful information for parents and students.

What are the signs that I or someone I care about may need help?

Get professional help if you or a loved one exhibits or expresses any of these signs: Hopelessness or a feeling that he has no reason to live Withdrawal or isolation Talking about wanting to die or to kill herself Talking about being a burden to others Increasing use of alcohol or other substances Not getting enough sleep or sleeping all the time Being chronically irritable or having angry outbursts Significant changes in eating habits What are other risk factors for suicide? Other life circumstances can make a person more likely to consider suicide. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline suggests watching for these risk factors: Previous suicide attempt(s) Family history of suicide Exposure to others who have died by suicide Mental disorders, particularly mood disorders, schizophrenia, anxiety disorders, and certain personality disorders History of trauma or abuse Major physical illness Job or financial loss Loss of relationship(s) Lack of social support and sense of isolation Stigma associated with asking for help Alcohol and other substance use disorders Lack of healthcare, especially mental health and substance abuse treatment Easy access to lethal means Cultural and religious beliefs, such as the belief that suicide is a noble resolution of a personal dilemma

These suicide risk factors cannot cause or predict that someone may attempt or die by suicide. If you see any of these warning signs, do something as they may increase a person's risk for suicide.

What can I do to help myself or someone I care about?

When someone is in crisis, they feel a loss of control and sometimes feel there is no solution. Their pain may be overwhelming and take over their entire life. They may have trouble thinking clearly, are often unable to function, and cannot find any way to feel better.

What do I do if someone I know is thinking about suicide?

Get involved and be available. Show interest and support.

Be direct. Talk openly and matter-of-factly about suicide.

Really listen and allow them to express their feelings.

Be non-judgmental. Don't debate whether suicide is right or wrong, or whether feelings are good or bad. Do not lecture on the value of life.

Don't dare them to do it.

Don't act shocked.

Don't be sworn to secrecy. Get help for yourself and your friend or loved one.

Act. Remove the method, such as any weapons or pills.

Don't wait. Get help from other people or agencies that specialize in crisis intervention and suicide prevention.
