#### Forward Exam:

Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will take the state of Wisconsin Forward Exam during the month of April or May. The students will take this on a chromebook and a schedule will be shared with you once we are closer to the testing window. All students will take tests in English Language Arts (ELA) and Math. In addition, students in grade 4 will take Science and Social Studies tests. The Luther staff is working hard to make sure students are prepared. Parents can help in this process by ensuring students get a good amount of sleep each night, eat breakfast in the morning and are at school on time.



# WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUT LIBRATY CLASSES?

Each class has a library class with Mrs. Westby two times during the ten day cycle. Each class meets for 30 minutes. We continue to do library book exchange with all the virtual students while students in- person do library checkout during library class time.

Here is what they have been learning in that class during the month of April:

**KINDErGARTEN:** Reviewed how to login, use the touchpad and access information on their chromebook.Learned how to navigate up and down with two fingers on the trackpad. Began to understand how to use the chromebook to access internet sites to play some educational math games.

**1ST GraDe:** Introduced Google Slides and how to replace photos. Collaborated with the classroom teachers to replace photos for their research publication about animals. Practicing keyboard familiarity and alphabet location on paper.

**2ND GraDe:** Focused on keyboarding by practicing with the program Dance Mat. Began to read Gum Girl Book 3 and continued to introduce recreational reading chapter books.

**STD GraDe:** Introduced and practiced the tools features for the state testing Forward Exam for math and ELA. Introduced emails and how to delete them. Discussed digital citizenship topics about privacy and online personal information.

**4TH GraDe:** Introduced and practiced the tools features for the state testing Forward Exam for math, ELA, science, and social studies. Deleted and cleaned out emails. Discussed digital citizenship topics about being a super digital citizen.

**5TH GraDe:** troduced and practiced the tools features for the state testing Forward Exam for math and ELA.. Deleted and cleaned out emails. Discussed digital citizenship topics about clickbaiting and cyberbullying.



# Important Immunization Information for 5th Grade Students Vaccine Requirement for 6th Grade Students

The Wisconsin Student Immunization Law requires a dose of Tdap vaccine for students entering 6th grade. To be compliant with this law, parents must provide their child's school with proof of immunization or claim a waiver.

Tdap is the adolescent combination vaccine that protects against Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (Whooping Cough). One dose is required.

All students entering 6th grade in the fall will need a Tdap vaccination or waiver by October 2021.

• Please speak with your healthcare provider about this state law, as it is a grade requirement, not an age requirement. If your provider recommends waiting for the Tdap vaccine, please have that provider complete a Student Immunization Record form indicating a health waiver for the vaccine.

#### Exceptions to the Tdap Requirement:

• If your child received a tetanus-containing vaccine (such as Td vaccine after an injury), within the last 5 years of entering the grade it is required, your child is compliant and the Tdap vaccine is not required.

#### Additional information:

- If you plan to claim a waiver, complete the Student Immunization Record form by indicating either Health (also requires physician signature), Religious, or Personal Conviction reason. Please sign and date the form. The Student Immunization Record form can be found on the SDFA website (Health Services).
- Please return the completed form to the Middle School Pupil Services Office or the School Nurse Office.
