#### Juniors and Seniors Looking to Earn the College and Career Ready Diploma

This diploma requires an endorsement. Students who have not met this requirement can do so in **one** of the following ways:

- Retake the ACT and earn at least an 18 in English AND a 22 in math.
  - Schedule a retake for the ACT here.
- Earn an ASVAB score of 50 or higher.
  - If you tested in October, contact your counselor to get your results. It will be offered again in the spring, date TBD.
  - Learn more about the ASVAB and how it can help with career prep here.
- Earn your CTE Skill Attainment (Programs include Video Production, Multimedia Communications, Business, Furniture and Cabinetmaking, Teaching and Training, Biomedical, and Theater Tech)
  - Complete your CTE program with a 3.0 average GPA or higher.
  - Pass both the End of Program Assessment AND the CTE Workplace Readiness Skills Assessment.
- Obtain your Southern Nevada Food Handler Card.
  - Schedule a testing appointment <u>here</u> and access study materials <u>here</u>.
  - An example of the card issued is to the right. Cards from other organizations will not be accepted.
  - Send a picture of the card to your counselor, so it can be uploaded and approved.
- Obtain your CPR/First Aid/AED Certification through the American Red Cross or the American Heart Association
  - The course must include the following verbiage: "Upon successful completion students will receive a valid 2 year Red Cross digital certificate that is OSHA compliant and meets other workplace and regulatory requirements."
  - Find classes here: American Red Cross or American Heart Association.
  - Click here for examples of cards that will be accepted. Cards obtained through other organizations will not be accepted.
  - Send a picture of your card to your counselor, so it can be uploaded and approved.
