- 5. The MCCSC Office of High Ability Education has begun the middle school high ability identification/application process for the 2019-2020 school year for



incoming 7th grade students. Notification letters will be mailed on Friday, January 25, 2019 to current sixth grade students who automatically qualify for middle school high ability services (advanced ELA or ALPS) based on scores on the In View and NWEA assessments. Application materials for students who want to appeal for placement in middle school high ability programs are due to the Office of High Ability Education on or before Friday, February 8, 2019.
