DuFief Construction Updates





Phase Two of our construction project is well underway and moving along nicely. The goals of Phase Two of the project include converting the existing art room and one kindergarten classroom to accommodate the new front office suite and health suite and building a lim-

ited access security vestibule. The photos to the left show the main office/reception area conversion including the new front desk. The current time frame has front office staff moving into the new spaces shortly after the school year ends. Once moved over, work will then begin on building the security vestibule.

As you may have seen the notices posted around the building, this



latest phase of the projection involves some asbestos abatement with old flooring tile being removed.

Because of the construction work being completed to the front of our building, there will be very limited access to the building during the summer. We will continue to be accessible via our phone line, 240-740-1600, and via email for any questions you may have.

CROWN HIGH SCHOOL BOUNDARY STUDY

We have heard from some families who have been asking for more information regarding plans for the proposed Crown High School. To address spacing needs in the mid-county region, planning and construction has been approved for the new Crown High School which is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2027. The new high school is expected to reduce populations at Gaithersburg, Northwest, Quince Orchard, Richard Montgomery, and Thomas S. Wootton high schools. The process will begin with a boundary study. Please see the proposed timeline of the process which was approved in the March 19th, 2024 MCPS Board of Education (BoE) meeting. Because elementary schools do not articulate directly to Wootton High School, the Board of Education resolution states "no elementary schools be included in the boundary study.
