## Attention: AP Students

AP Exams begin May 6. Please arrive at 7.30 for morning exams and 11.30 for afternoon exams. Your attendance will be excused for the class periods you are testing. If you are taking an afternoon exam, you are responsible for arranging transportation home. There are no late buses.

Prohibited Items include cell phones or other wearable technology, books, compasses, correction fluid or tape, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, mechanical pencils, colored pencils, protractors, computers, or scratch paper, rulers or straightedges (allowed only for physics exams), watches with alarms, clothing with subjectrelated information, ear plugs & clipboards.

Allowed items include number 2 pencils, pens with blue or black ink only, a silent watch with no internet connectivity, up to TWO approved calculators for approved tests. Food & drinks are allowed ONLY during the break.

Plan accordingly, especially for afternoon exams. Students will NOT be allowed to leave prior to official dismissal. If a student leaves before dismissal, their scores will be subject to cancellation.
