Flu Clinic

MCCSC is working in partnership with IU Health to offer flu vaccines to your children. If your child does not have health insurance, has Medicaid, or has insurance that



doesn't cover immunizations, there is no charge for the vaccine. If your child has insurance that covers vaccines at any level, insurance will be billed. A form was sent out in the middle of September with additional information, including the form to complete to authorize the immunization.

Immunizations will be given on October 10th.

The deadline to return forms was September 27th.

October Lifeline and Learner Profile

For the month of October, we will focus on the Lifeline of "Initiative" and the Learner Profile of "Thinkers."

Bully Prevention Month

October is Bully Prevention Month. Below are the weekly themes. In addition to this, Mr. Simonton, our school's social worker, will be engaging classes in education opportunities.



Week 1: (Oct. 1-4) Take the Challenge a Month of Action Against Bullying

Students and staff sign a standing up to bullying pledge.

Themed day: (Oct. 4th) Wear mismatched socks to show it is ok to be different.

Week 2 (Oct. 7-11) Make new friends

Mix up lunch table day where kids sit with kids at different tables at lunch than they normally do. Themed day: (Oct 7th) is World Bullying Day and is #Blueup where everyone is encouraged to where blue in solidarity against bullying on that day.

Week 3 (Oct. 16-18) Stand up for others week

Each grade will lead the anti-bully pledge on the intercom over the course of the week. Themed Day: (October 18th) Stand up against bullying. Wear something representing your favorite super hero.

Week 4 (Oct. 21-25) Week of Inclusion

No one sits or plays alone. Students and staff are encouraged to reach out to children that may be eating alone or playing alone outside. Themed Day: (Oct 23rd) is Unity Day to wear and share orange uniting for kindness, acceptance and inclusion. This is pushed by the Pacer's National Bullying Prevention

Center.

Week 5 (Oct. 28-Nov. 1) Speaking Out about Bullying

Students will make posters to post around school or their class for the week about speaking up against bullying and for inclusion. Themed Day: (Nov. 1st) Team up against bullying - wear your favorite team or school shirt to team up against bullying.



MCCSC Textbook Fees

From an email sent out by the MCCSC Business Office (slightly modified):

The Textbook Rental Fee is established within the Indiana Code (IC 20-26-12). This Code has been in place for many years in the State of Indiana and requires the Governing Body of each school Corporation to purchase curricular materials and rent the materials to each student by charging appropriate fees to reimburse the costs of the materials.

Families with students in grades K-6 may see their fee schedule on the MCCSC website (www.mccsc.edu). These fees are already calculated by grade based on curriculum needs.

Students in grades 7-12 will have their fees determined based on their class schedule which they should have already received. After class schedules have been finalized, then the fees can be calculated and assessed to students.

Families with fees were notified of their balance on September 28, 2019, with fees due to MCCSC no later than November 30, 2019. Families are asked to log in to <u>Skyward Family</u> <u>Access</u> regarding their balance, and deadlines for payment. At this time, those listed as the primary contact for their student will be the recipient of the notices. Please make sure your email address in Skyward Family Access is correct. If your email needs updated please contact your building administrative assistant. Reminders about student balances and due dates will be included in the Corporation Family Newsletter that is sent out on a weekly basis.
