- The following procedures are in effect during the 2017-2018 school year regarding absence and tardy reporting:
 - Students who arrive at school more than two hours late will be recorded as absent for a half day.
 - \circ $\;$ Students who leave more than two hours early will be recorded as absent for a half day.
 - o If your child will be absent, or late for school, please notify the school office by calling 240-740-1840 or emailing
 - Students who are absent from school are expected upon their return to bring a note from a parent explaining the reason for the absence.
- To ensure safety and security for the children, **all parents and visitors to the school must sign in at the office**. Children who arrive late must stop in the office, sign in, and obtain a late slip before going to their class. Parents who need to take a child out of school for an appointment are asked to sign him or her out in the office before 3:05 pm.

- The school cafeteria uses a computerized cash register system. Every student in Montgomery County schools has an account to use. All students have a PIN (personalized identification number). To access the account at mealtime, a student enters his/her PIN on a keypad. When a cashier rings up breakfast, lunch or a la carte items, the total amount of the sale is deducted from the prepaid balance in the account. Students who receive free and reduced price meals enter their PIN when purchasing a meal. The system recognizes their PIN and charges, or does not charge, accordingly. Any amount can be deposited into the student's account. Meals and a la carte items are deducted from the account only at the time of purchase. The school meals account is not a credit system. Deposits to the school meal account can be made with a check. Write the student's name and PIN number on the front of the check and make it payable to the school cafeteria. If you have more than one child in school, you can write one check for all your children. Be sure to write each student's name and PIN on the check so that it can be properly credited. Please indicate the deposit amount for each student next to the name. Place the deposit money in an envelope with "Cafeteria" written on the front so the office staff knows where it should go. At the start of the school year, any money left on the account from the previous year will be available for the new school year. Students returning to the same school keep the same PIN. When a student enters a different Montgomery County school from the last year, the student receives a new PIN.
- Free and reduced meal benefit eligibility from last school year will remain current only through September 2017 or until a 2017-2018 application is processed. We will send the forms home to eligible families with the youngest child in each family once they are available.

• My School Bucks is an optional service for parents to view recent purchases and make prepayments on your child's cafeteria account via the internet using a debit or credit card. This service is offered as a convenience for interested families. There is a 41.95 convenience fee for each transaction.
