It's hard to believe Fall is here and first semester is in full swing. Homecoming was a great success and school spirit was abundant. We have received exciting news that we have four seniors who are National Merit Semi-Finalists: Mason Crabtree, Brock Kaufmann, Matthew Miller and Travis Nebeker. What an amazing accomplishment for these students and their families. We wish them the best of luck in the next part of the process. It is important for all students to be academically challenged at Olathe East as we prepare them for their next steps after high school. The Olathe East faculty understands that when students have to grapple with a concept and work to learn, that struggle helps learning stay in long-term memory. It is important we give our students authentic learning experiences that are meaningful, relevant and timely. When we do this, our students retain the material instead of temporarily memorizing it only to forget it later.

We will be holding our annual Olathe School's Assessment Day across the District on October 19. Each grade level will have specific activities they will be taking a part in on that day. Our 9th grade students will be taking the ACT Explore that will provide valuable feedback regarding your student's preparation and career interests. The sophomore class will take the ACT Plan. This is a follow-up to the Explore. Juniors will take the practice ACT. All three grade levels had the option of also signing up for the PSAT, which is the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. As the date of this newsletter, the registration date for the PSAT has passed. Seniors may use this day to visit a college, or they will need to attend school beginning at 8:00am. We have planned a special breakfast for them, they will meet with Jostens in regards to their caps, gowns, invitations and other items and should be finished around 11:45. For our freshmen, sophomores and juniors this is a half day of school as well, beginning at 8:00am and ending at noon. Lunch is not served this day. Busses will run and will be here at 11:45. Please make sure your student is in attendance this day. These tests will garner valuable data for you and your student.

Looking Ahead

Studying in Germany

Olathe East Junior Molly Carlson and three other Olathe students have been selected to spend the 2016-2017 school year in Germany as part of the Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange Scholarship Program.

Initiated in 1983, Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange was created to strengthen ties between Germany and the United States through citizen diplomacy. The program was founded in celebration of the 300th year anniversary of the first German immigration to the United States. CBYX is jointly funded by the U.S. Congress and the German Bundestag, and in the U.S. is overseen by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Students undergo a rigorous selection process of essays and interviews. Throughout the United States, a total of 250 students were chosen to participate this year.

The students began their year abroad in July in an intensive language program near Magdeburg in north central Germany and then were placed in host families throughout Germany where they will attend school and learn about the German lifestyle. As student ambassadors, they will attend a reception at the German Parliament (Bundestag) during their stay, then meet with U.S. Congress upon their return in June 2017. Molly's host family lives near the city of Stuttgart, the capital of Baden Wuerttemberg in Southwest Germany near the Black Forest. She will be attending a Gymnasium, a college prep high school. The other students are Sean Yake and Arielle von der Heyde from Olathe South and Ryan Horn, a 2016 graduate from Olathe Northwest High School.

Olathe East Assessment Day

October 9, 2016/8:00 am-12:00 pm

Grade 9 Students will choose ACT EXPLORE or practice PSAT Grade 10 Students will choose ACT PLAN or practice PSAT Grade 11 Students will choose practice ACT, ASVAB or PSAT

On Wednesday, October 19, the ACT EXPLORE and ACT PLAN will be administered to most of our Grade 9 and Grade 10 students. These tests provide students an opportunity to assess their potential for success on the ACT. Some grade 9 and grade 10 students are registered to take the PSAT for practice.

Grade 11 students will have the opportunity to take a practice ACT, the ASVAB or the PSAT – the preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. No registration for the practice ACT is required. Students may register for the ASVAB in the counseling office. The ASVAB will be administered at Olathe North High School this year. On-line registration for the PSAT was required in September.

ACT Prep

There are many opportunities throughout the school year to attend ACT Prep sessions. All opportunities are listed on the daily announcements, and on the OE website. Additional information may be available in the counseling office.

JCCC Updates

QUICK STEP PLUS COLLEGE ALGEBRA (QSPCA): College Algebra is a concurrent enrollment course set up with slight differences from College Now. Your high school grade is given by the high school teacher while the JCCC grade is given by a JCCC professor. Your high school enrollment still stands separately from your JCCC enrollment. Being enrolled in a class at the high school does not automatically enroll you in QSPCA. To earn college credit, complete the steps as outlined in materials from JCCC.

QUICK STEP PLUS COLLEGE ALGEBRA (QSPCA) DEADLINES SEPTEMBER 30, 2016

• Priority Application submission deadline (online – JCCC website). Students may apply after this date. Applications may take 3-5 business days to process.

• Your ACT score are on your transcript.

• ACT test score priority submission deadline. Please request transcripts to be sent to JCCC through www.parchment.com OCTOBER 14, 2016

 COMPASS placement test deadline. An ACT math sub-score of 25 or higher exempts you from taking the COMPASS math placement test. Check the website for study guides and Testing Lab hours- http://www.jccc.edu/admissions/testing/placement/index.html
Enrollment deadline – payment is due at the time of enrollment
