TEAMS Wins State Competition

Berry Middle School's engineering team has done it again! For the fifth year in a row Berry's TEAMS (Tests of Engineering Aptitude, Math, and Science) team has placed first in the state competition. Our team is comprised of 6th-8th graders who compete with other middle schools across the state.

Each year topics are given to all participating schools. The theme for the competition this year was Engineering the Environment. The topics this year were Building a Better Environment, Global Health, Green Energy Basics and Reducing Light pollution. Once the topics are released our students research the topics to understand what types of questions they might be asked. They are essentially trying to become experts on these topics in order to make logical recommendations about implementation.


Before the in-person competition, the team writes and submits an essay on one of the topics. The students research a topic, summarize the information, and give educated suggestions. This year's essay topic was LEED Certification. The prompt was: Recent efforts toward greening within engineering have focused on energy saving within buildings. Newly constructed buildings are often built to be LEED certified, meaning they are designed in such a way as to conserve energy.

BERRY POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Protect Your Chromebook

In order to prevent breaks, please consider taking the following precautions to keep chromebooks in good condition:

- Get a chromebook case that stays on the device at all times.
- Only add educational extensions recommended by teachers.
- Don't keep your chromebook in your backpack. It can be cracked by the weight of other books or by handling the backpack too roughly.
- Avoid using the chromebook while walking, and don't leave them on the floor.
- Avoid storing the chromebook in lockers unless necessary.
- Treat them as the fragile objects they are be

If your chromebook still needs repair:

- 1. Chromebooks needing repair should be brought to the library.
- 2. When chromebooks return to Berry, they will be stored in the 7th grade office. They will be delivered to students ASAP.
- 3. If a student owes a fee for a repair, they may receive a fee slip rather than a chromebook. However, they may now pay at Berry! Please send any students wanting to make payments with cash or checks to the 7th grade office. They will receive a receipt to bring home to parents, and I will keep another copy of the receipt for our records. Parents may also pay online at https://secure4.myschoolfees.com.
- 4. Payments made online with a Mastercard or Discover or in person in cash will ensure chromebook delivery in a day or two. Payments by check online will have

to clear the bank before the chromebook can be returned to the student. This could take up to 10 days - a long time when a kid needs a chromebook! Paper checks brought to the 7th grade office must include a phone number, driver's license number, and the student's name.

New Instructions for paying online:

- 1. Go to https://secure4.myschoolfees.com/
- 2. Log in using the e-mail and password you set up during registration.
- 3. Select the "Student Items" tab.
- 4. Select "Show Student Fees" on the Berry Middle School account for your child. Do not use IT account.
- 5. Select the chromebook fee.
- 6. Click on "add to cart"
- 7. Click on "Checkout."

- #4: Leggings/jeggings/tights are NOT considered pants and must be worn with a long dress or skirt.
- #7: Pants and skirts with holes above the knee are not allowed.
- #8: Shorts, dresses, and skirts must be hemmed and not shorter than mid-thigh when student is seated. Shorts that are torn, in disrepair, or spandex are not allowed.
