School wide, we will continue to focus on teaching respect for others, empathy, & kindness, emphasizing the importance of treating others as they would like to be treated, all of which are possible while continuing to follow rules, routines, expectations, & policies in the total school environment.

Any unclear water bottles on campus MUST be stored in the student's locker during the instructional day.
