DISTANCE LEARNING INFORMATION

The following information was sent through email from Granite School District:

Dear Distance Learning Families:

As we approach the 4th quarter, we are pleased to see that case counts within our community continue to decline significantly. The data is clear, and we continue to work hand in hand with our local and state health officials towards providing a safe learning environment in the midst of this pandemic. Granite District is committed to adhering to their guidance. We have seen a great deal of success as a result of this commitment.

- Confirmed transmission of COVID on school property is less than 2%. The overwhelming majority of transmission is occurring between family members and social contacts at home or off of school property.
- Mask wearing has been very effective and students and staff are doing a great job of adhering to our health directives on school property. State officials estimate that when masks are worn, less than 1% of those considered to have been exposed (less than 6 feet from an infected individual for an extended period of time) have also gotten COVID. **Masks are working to prevent spread!**

- Case data from the Health Department shows that our **schools are a safe place**. You can access confirmed case information here <u>https://datamanager.graniteschools.org/Covid/PublicDashboard</u>
- Vaccine distribution for teachers and staff will wrap up in the next few weeks. Over 68% of our staff members have received the vaccine which will further help reduce case counts within our schools.

We recognize that many families have extenuating circumstances, students or family members with underlying health concerns, or other questions or concerns with in-person instruction. **We respect your rights as a parent to decide on your child's education. However, based on this data, we highly encourage you to consider in-person instruction for your student to the extent that you are able to.** In-person instruction can provide many advantages for your child's educational development.

Secondary schools can work with you and your family to transition by speaking with your guidance counselor. For elementary schools, in-person/distance learning forms will be sent home on Thursday February 25th and are due back to your school by Friday, March 12th. Please don't hesitate to reach out to your school principal or the district communications office if you have specific questions that we can assist you with.

Instructions to log into SHMOOP are below!

Accessing Shmoop

1. Go to schools.shmoop.com OR use the drop-down button in the top left corner of your Chromebook and click on Shmoop.

2. Click "Go" next to where it says "Need to register with a new school or starting a new year?"



3. Enter student Magic Word: WASATCH (all caps)

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4. You'll be directed to Shmoop's Utah page

5. From there, select your school from the alphabetized list (Cottonwood High - you will choose it twice).

6. Next, create your account if you are new to Shmoop (use your @granitesd.org email !!!)

Log in using your password from last year (there is a Forgot Password option if you need it.) E \Rightarrow

Click on Go to My Dashboard or on the SHMOOP logo in the upper left-hand corner.



Once you are on the main page, find the Test Prep Shtuff section. Click on ACT. You can set up a plan for studying and prepping for the ACT OR go straight to the diagnostics, drills, and practice exams.
