The final 2021-2022 meeting of the York County Council (YCC) PTA was held on May 12, 2022. Felicia Brown-Anderson, PTSA President, represents BHS members at the meeting. Additionally, Jenny Hindman (BHS Hospitality Co-Chair) serves as the YCC Secretary. At the meeting, there was discussion about local units (i.e., schools) and upcoming items that will be necessary to remain in compliance. BHS is in good standing as are the majority of YCSD PTA local units (i.e., schools). Forty-four percent of YCCPTA schools will have delegates at the Virginia PTA Annual meeting. There was discussion of the 2021-2022 PTA Reflections Program where three YCSD students received awards at the state level. One student advanced to the national level. Next year's theme is *Show Your Voice*.

The 2022-2023 York County Council PTA Board needs a Vice-President of Compliance. ## Virtual 1-on-1 FAFSA and VASA Assistance for Virginia Students and Families

*Free assistance to increase FAFSA and VASA completion for Virginia students*

### **FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE**

**Richmond, VA** – To assist students and families file the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA) and the [Virginia Alternative State Aid](#) (VASA) application, the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV) and the Virginia College Access Network have partnered on a statewide effort to offer one-on-one assistance. **These free appointments will occur from April 1 – June 15, 2022.**

Registration is now live. To make an appointment in either English or Spanish, students and families should visit [www.virginiacan.org/fafsa](http://www.virginiacan.org/fafsa). During their appointment, students will be connected with an access provider from [ECMC's The College Places](#), [Great Aspirations Scholarship Program \(GRASP\)](#), or the [Virginia College Advising Corps \(VCAC\)](#) who will guide them through the process of completing either the FAFSA or VASA application.

This statewide FAFSA/VASA assistance effort is designed to address lower FAFSA completion rates among low-income and underrepresented students; and assist with the VASA application for those ineligible to file a FAFSA, including Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients and undocumented students.

“High school graduates in Virginia who were unable to complete the FAFSA in 2021 left \$76 million in Pell Grants on the table according to the National College Attainment Network. This free aid could have made the difference in thousands of students continuing their education, collecting greater earnings over their lifetime and improving their quality of life,” said Erin McGrath, SCHEV’s assistant director of college access & PK12 outreach.

## 2022-23 School Year Calendar

The School Board has approved the 2022-23 school year calendar. The first day of school will be Monday, August 29, 2022. Under state law, the Friday before Labor Day must be a student holiday, creating a 4-day weekend. [Next year's calendar](#) is available on the division website.

## Food Services Update

For the past two school years, meals have been provided to all YCSD students at no cost through a waiver provided by the USDA. This waiver will not be reissued. Instead, breakfast and lunch meals will return to a paid status, with no charges allowed, beginning this summer.

Free or reduced price meals will be available (upon application and approval) to students whose family income falls within federally established guidelines. Families with students participating in Summer Academy programs who would like to take advantage of free or reduced price meal options are asked to submit applications by **Wednesday, June 1, 2022**, if applications have not already been submitted. # Early College / Dual Enrollment Program

*A partnership between YCSD and TNCC*

## PROGRAM SNAPSHOT

### Participants will:

- Enroll in Virtual High School for fall semester and TNCC for spring semester
- Remain eligible for all YCSD activities (athletics, prom and graduation)
- Earn up to 20 transferrable college credit hours at significantly reduced costs
- 50% of course tuition fees paid by YCSD (additional support available for eligible students)
- Increase college readiness skills
- Receive academic and counseling support during the transition to college

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum Cumulative GPA of 3.0
- US Government and English 12 are only courses needed to graduate
- Individual course grades, attendance, and discipline are taken into consideration
- Completion of Algebra II is highly recommended\*

*\*Algebra II is a pre-requisite for Precalculus math MTH 161 or General Chemistry CHM 111, and most four year institutions require Algebra II.*

### Semester 1: Fall of Senior Year

- Students complete courses from home through Virtual High School in 16-week format

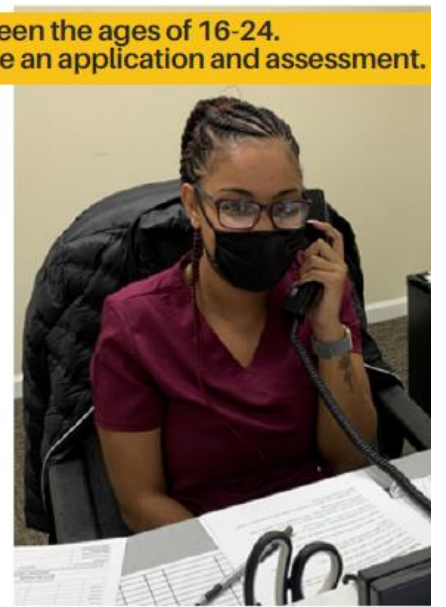
