Dear Families and Community,

We have loved every minute of launching this school year, from coming together in person as a staff in August, to our Community Serve Day when our school got some much-needed pruning and polishing, to our first day with 1st-5th graders and finally, welcoming our kindergarteners this week.

Every year has its own personality and rhythm, and the mood so far this year has been calm, grounded, and aware. Our older students really appreciate, see and listen to each other and our younger students seem accepting, kind and independent. I'm sure this group, like any other, will have its challenges and tricky spots, but it's been a lovely start to school. Staff have been busy introducing children to classroom and school routines and getting to know your child as an individual and a learner. Classroom communities are growing closer as children reconnect after summer break and get to know new classmates and teachers.

Your child has now been to music, PE and library. They will all have experienced lunch and recess. Many of them will have learned about classroom jobs and may even have an assigned classroom job. These are things you can ask your child about. You can ask where they like to play during recess. Grades 3-5 have the field, the dirt field, the "wood chip" area or the basketball courts and blacktop area. Grades K-2 have the play structure, the basketball court, the woods, the play structure at the top of the woods, and the blacktop area. Asking your child about recess and their preferred play-space and playmates will start opening the conversation about a valuable social and emotional classroom, recess.

Safety Patrol Needs You! Calling All 3rd, 4th, and 5th Graders



What: Arrowhead Safety Patrollers demonstrate kindness, responsibility and community safety by assisting with morning drop-off or afternoon pick-up. Patrollers keep the car drop-off and pick-up lines moving smoothly and they open / close car doors for students.

When: Safety Patrollers will work for a week at a time with their team. Patrollers sign up for either a morning shift or an afternoon shift. <u>Patrollers</u> <u>must be dropped off or picked up by their families</u>. Please choose the shift that works for your family.

- Morning Shift: 8:40am 8:57am
- Afternoon Shift: 3:27pm 3:45pm

Who: 3rd, 4th and 5th graders serve as Safety Patrollers. They work with Ms. Borgers (5th grade teacher in Room 302).

How: Students interested in Safety Patrol need to return a signed permission slip and attend mandatory training with Ms. Borgers. Schedules will be posted on the Safety Patrol Schoology page, emailed to families and posted inside the Safety Patrol closet in the library foyer.

- 1. Decide whether Safety Patrol is right for you.
- 2. Choose the shift that works for your family (morning or afternoon).

From the Health Room

Welcome back to School! We are excited to have your students back on campus with fewer COVID restrictions, it will be a great year!

My hours this school year are 9-3:30pm and 2pm on early release Wednesdays. I am happy to meet with you if needed anytime between 9-3pm (9-1:30pm on early Wednesdays) and I am available by appointment outside of these hours with a day or two notice. Please contact me if your student has any changes to their health information, including injuries occurring outside of school, that may require some accommodations while at school.

It is very important for us to be able to reach you if your child is ill or injured and needs to go home. Please be sure your contact numbers are up to date, and that you have at least one or more emergency contacts that can be reached during the school day to pick up your child if you are unable. Students must be picked up within an hour. We cannot look after ill or injured students at school for longer periods.

Note: All students with one or more ill symptoms at school (including mild headache or runny nose), will be required to wait for pick-up in our isolation room.

Covid 19 Update

Students with one or more potential COVID symptoms (fever, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, muscle or body aches, new loss of taste or smell, cough, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, sore throat, congestion, or runny nose) are required to stay home and test for COVID-19. Home antigen tests are recommended.

Students with one or more symptoms need a negative COVID test <u>AND</u> a significant improvement in symptoms prior to returning to school.

If you do not have COVID tests at home, please contact the school nurse 425-408-4006 or ajanssen@nsd.org to arrange to pick-up a test kit.

If your child has recently tested positive for COVID on ANY test (antigen or PCR), please notify the school nurse, Anne Janssen, at ajanssen@nsd.org to report the positive test. Please include the date of the positive test and the date of the onset of symptoms if present. The school nurse will respond via email with information about the duration of isolation, a return to school plan, and will contact your student's teacher regarding isolation learning support.

Please note: All students are required to wear a mask through the 10th day when returning to school after a positive COVID test, regardless of a negative antigen test before day 10. If your student is unable (or unwilling) to wear a mask, they must continue to isolate at home through Day 10.

If your child is sick with an illness other than COVID, please make sure they do not return to school until symptoms have subsided. Students must be fever-free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication and no vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.

Vision & Hearing Screening at Arrowhead

Each year in Northshore schools, students in grades Kindergarten, 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7 receive hearing and vision screenings. We are currently scheduled for vision and hearing screenings on Monday Sept 26th. If you would like to exempt your child from either of these health screenings, please contact the school nurse.

It is important to understand that these are basic screenings and are designed to identify students who may require further testing. They are not intended to replace regular exams by qualified health care providers. A student who does not pass any screening will be rechecked in a few weeks, and you will be notified only if there are concerns after the second screening.

Vision screening uses the PlusOptix. The PlusOptix is an autorefractor that takes a measurement of the refraction of the eyes. The result is a baseline refraction measurement. The illumination technique used by Plusoptix, is totally harmless to the child's eyes. If your child wears glasses or contact lenses for distance or near vision, please be sure they have them on the screening day.

If your child has a hearing loss and is being followed by a healthcare provider or specialist and you do not wish for them to participate in the screening, please let the school nurse know. If you have concerns about hearing loss and school accommodations, contact your student's teacher or the school nurse.

A few volunteers are needed for Screening day, Monday Sept 26th, in the morning. Please complete the <u>online volunteer paperwork</u> if you are interested in helping. Please note, all volunteers are required to show proof of full vaccination against COVID-19 to be eligible to volunteer.
