Dear Parents:

Can you believe it is already Labor Day weekend? Our students have quickly settled back into the school routine and we are looking forward to partnering with them as they discover, create, and collaborate in their quest for knowledge.

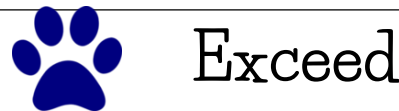
We have implemented several new pilot programs this year align with our school vision: All students will learn in an environment that fosters curiosity and creativity, promotes individual learning styles, and entices students to seek knowledge and solve problems.

- First, we have restructured our library into a *Learning Commons* area which will serve as the learning hub of the school. The spirit of the Learning Commons is to develop a space specifically designed to inspire creativity, foster curiosity, and prioritize collaboration among students and teachers. Our goal is to provide a collaborative physical and virtual environment that invites and ignites participatory learning by:
  - Promoting interdisciplinary real-world problems, projects, and learning experiences that take advantage of rich information, resources and useful technology tools.
  - Using technology to boost teaching and learning together.
  - Creating cultural experiences across the school, community, and the world.
  - Fostering creativity, innovation, play, building, and experimentation.
  - Providing space/materials for students to learn the coding component of the new elementary computer science standards
- The physical components of the Learning Commons Environment include:
  - Flexible seating on the carpet or hub area where students have an area to work with materials and/or a laptop.
  - Sharing space where students can research, share ideas, work in pairs or small groups on class or individual projects.
  - Individual Zone- comfortable seating soft, quiet places for students to read on their own, work on individual research, reading or creative design.
  - STEM space to build, design, experiment and create.
- Our next new initiative is the extension of our *STEM Lab*. We received a \$5,000 grant from the TN DOE to support student academic enrichment. This funding has enabled us to expand our current program by purchasing a Google Virtual Reality Expedition Kit, K'Nex kits, and materials and software for our green screen. Students will have the opportunity to enhance their critical thinking skills and creativity by utilizing technology through design challenges and science, math and engineering lessons. Students will strategically learn to define a problem, research, brainstorm, build a prototype, redesign and evaluate. Our school will implement 4 school-wide STEM Fair days this year to experiment with this equipment and work collaboratively on STEM challenges.



We have an exciting year ahead of engaging hands-on participatory learning. Please feel free to visit our new Learning Commons area and STEM Lab when you are in the building. Thank you for your continued support of our school community. Have a wonderful 3-day weekend.

- Fifth Graders are creating self portraits using different art media in each quarter of the composition.

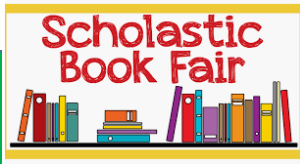
## CRES Chorus Information
