## **Principal's Note:**

Dear Ocean View Families,

As many of you are aware, the District released its proposed FY26 budget to balance the 100 million dollar structural deficit. Here's how the potential cuts will impact our school.

Class sizes would all increase. We would have an average of approximately 29 students per classroom. Some would be a little lower, and some a little higher. We would go from 11 teachers in kindergarten through 5th grade to just 9. This would likely mean a combination class at every grade level. (K, K/1, 1, 2, 2/3, 3, 4, 4/5, 5).

We would only have a part-time librarian and a part-time nurse. They would each be shared with another school.

We would only be able to have one Battle of the Books Team. We currently have 3. We would also lose three after-school programs. This could be the choir, Accelerated Reader, cross-country running, student council, etc. The specific programs to cut would be collaboratively decided by Ocean View staff.

Ignite would be eliminated.

This list is not exhaustive. Everyone will be impacted. Balancing this large of a deficit is extremely difficult. More information can be found on the FY26 Budget Solutions webpage under Important Information.

# **What is Healthy Futures?**

It is a statewide movement to help youth build positive, lifelong physical fitness habits.

## **Why Healthy Futures?**

Kids need daily vigorous physical activity to build strength, endurance, healthy muscles, and bones or they may face tough problems like obesity, diabetes, and lower self-esteem. In addition to positive impacts on physical and mental health, increased blood flow to the brain may also improve educational outcomes.

# How does your child participate in Healthy Futures?

Your child records physical activity on the Healthy Futures Activity Log. Qualifying logs must show at least 60 minutes of physical activity during a day, for at least 15 days of the month. PE and recess time counts this year!

Logs can be obtained online at <a href="http://healthyfuturesak.org">http://healthyfuturesak.org</a> or printed copies are located just inside the main entrance (or see attached). Students turn the completed logs in to Ms. Ireland or Nurse Lanaee no later than the 3rd of each month.

## Raptor Visitor Management FAQ (Public)

#### Why is a Districtwide visitor management system being implemented?

The Anchorage School District (ASD) is implementing Raptor Technologies visitor management system during the 2024-2025 school year to standardize visitor check-in procedures in all schools and add an extra layer of safety for students and staff. The system allows visitors, staff, and students to sign in and out using the self-service kiosk.

#### What are the benefits of the Raptor visitor management system?

- Quick and accurate visitor identity verification
- Enhanced ability to maintain a secure environment
- Accurate records of building occupants for emergency response

#### When will Raptor visitor management kiosks be installed in schools?

The District-wide implementation of Raptor Technologies visitor management kiosks will begin in the fall of 2024 with additional schools being added each week. The rollout is expected to be completed by early spring semester.

#### How does the sign-in/sign-out process work for visitors?

ASD requires all visitors entering a school building during school hours to show their government-issued photo ID and sign into the building. Visitors will sign-in/sign-out using the Raptor Technologies visitor management self-service kiosk. The visitor management system records the visitor's name, date of birth and last four digits of the ID and checks against a national database of registered sex offenders. No other data from IDs is gathered or recorded, ensuring privacy and confidentiality.

#### What if a person does not have a photo ID; can they still get into the school?

A principal will evaluate the purpose of the visit for visitors without a photo ID and make a determination. If access is granted, the visit will be monitored and limited solely to the area where the visitor needs to go. The visitor will be asked to provide their first and last name, as well as their date of birth to the Raptor system; this information will be checked against the offender database. Assuming clearance, a visitor's pass will be issued. A visitor shall be denied access on subsequent visits without an approved photo ID.

#### How does this sign-in/sign-out process work for students?

Schools can opt to record student late arrivals and early departures using the Raptor visitor management system.

#### Are visitors/parents required to sign in during pick-up and drop-off?

No. Schools encourage drop off at the door, but for younger students (Pre-K, Kindergarten) some schools may allow parents to escort their child to their classroom. School staff will ensure that parents enter and exit properly. Parents who enter the school and stay in the front office while signing in or signing out a student are not required to show their government issued I.D.

# Raptor Visitor Management FAQ (Public)

#### For school events held during the school day, do all attendees need to sign in?

No. Attendees at school events held during the school day do not need to sign in at the Raptor kiosk. School staff will ensure that attendees do not have access to the rest of school and stay at the event.

#### Do classroom volunteers sign in?

Yes. Classroom volunteers are visitors and should sign-in at the Raptor kiosk.

#### Do ASD staff also sign in?

Yes, all ASD staff who do not work in the school building each day (e.g., IT, maintenance, itinerant, subs) will sign in as visitors using the Raptor visitor management self-service kiosk.

# Are police officers, firemen and other uniformed or similar governmental officials scanned into the system?

Yes. This is to allow staff to know who is in a school at all times. However, law enforcement, fire, and CPS personnel on official business are allowed to enter the building to handle the situation for which they are called.

#### What Board policies govern how visitors gain access to a school?

Board Policy 1260 states, "The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures to facilitate visits during regular school days and register all visitors at the school office when entering school ground goard Policy 3515.2 adds, "The School Board is committed to keeping the schools safe from intruders and requires all visitors to register upon coming on campus," and 3515.5 details additional restrictions regarding sex offenders on campus.




