Free Flu Vaccination Clinic

Despite the hundred degree temperatures, Fall is here! with the change of the seasons comes additional illnesses, viruses, etc. While the timing of flu season is unpredictable, seasonal flu activity often begins to increase in October, most commonly peaks between December and February, but can last as late as May.

On Tuesday, October 8th 2019, Rancho Sienna will host an optional free flu vaccination clinic provided by Health Heroes of America. If you are wanting the flu vaccine for your child, you <u>MUST</u> provide the

consent form below to Nurse Carpenter. Unfortunately, the district is not using the same provider as last year, so a new form will have to be completed and provided to Nurse Carpenter in order to receive the vaccination.

Nurse Carpenter needs a few helpers during the flu vaccination clinic to gather/return students, and to help keep students calm and quiet during the process. Are you up for the challenge? If so, <u>sign up here</u> and give it a shot!

Santa Is Coming To Rancho Sienna Elementary!


Rancho Sienna Elementary Christmas Shopping Event

New Walker Route Begins Today

In order to promote safety for our students, we have created an additional GREEN walker route from the campus which will take students back west along Bonnet Blvd. Please see the map for the location where students will be released. Students in the GREEN line will **not** cross Bonnet Blvd. As always, all students will be escorted by a RSES staff member to their walker locations. Students that are in Pre-K, Kindergarten, and First Grade, **MUST** be met by an adult.

Dress Code

Dress Code Policy

A friendly reminder that the district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

1. Apparel and/or accessories that contain references to race, alcohol products, tobacco products, drugs, sex, vulgarity, death, suicide, the occult, or violence – either explicitly or by innuendo – are prohibited.

2. Apparel and/or accessories that denote gang related association are prohibited (i.e., rags, bandannas, shirts draped over the shoulder, shaved/notched eyebrows, or other physical alterations as identified by local law enforcement).

3. Excessively worn, frayed, or altered clothing is prohibited.

4. Extreme hairstyles are prohibited (i.e., Mohawks, unusually or unnaturally colored hair, excessively spiked hair, etc.) and student's eyes must be visible.

5. Male's hair must be above the collar in back and midpoint of the ear.

6. Piercings are prohibited for males. Females may have piercings in the ear. Piercing retainers (clear studs) and covering piercing jewelry with tape or bandage are prohibited. Gauges are prohibited.

7. Caps, hats, head coverings, and/or dark glasses are prohibited inside the building.

8. Strapless, spaghetti strap, plunging, and low cut tops are prohibited.

9. Trench coats are prohibited at school and school functions.

10. Pants must be size appropriate and worn at the natural waistline. No sagging pants. Clothing must not reveal underwear.

11. Shorts, skirts, and/or dresses must be longer than the student's fingertips when arms are fully extended down the sides of the body. Yoga pants and leggings must be covered by a shirt, skirt, or dress that is longer than the student's fingertips when arms are fully extended down the sides of the body.

12. Shoes must be worn at all times. House shoes and shoes with wheels are prohibited. 6 13. Dog collars, choker chains, spiked metal items (i.e., necklaces, wrist bands, etc.), safety pins, wallet chains, and/or chains on garments are prohibited.

14. The administration has the right to evaluate any current fashion or fad and determine whether or not it is appropriate for school. If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

At 8 a.m. on Thursday, October 31st, we will have our Storybook Character Parade. All costumes need to be associated with a book. This can be a book that students bring with them on that day, from the library, or one they write themselves, but all costumes must accompany a book. No masks, face paint, or scary/bloody/gory costumes please. Students should bring a change of clothes if their outfit will not allow for classroom learning and physical activity afterward. Parents wishing to just view the parade may enter through the front cafeteria doors for seating to view the parade procession. These guests will then exit those same doors and not have access to the building. If you are volunteering for Fall Fest on that day as well, you should plan to show your ID at the front office to receive your visitor/volunteer badge.



Change to Attendance Communication

Beginning next week if your child is reported absent, parents will receive an automated phone call. The phone call will go to the primary contact. If there are more primary contacts listed for your child, each parent or family member will be notified.

Student growth is our biggest goal here at Rancho, and in order to achieve that goal, student daily attendance is a priority for continued success in school. When students are absent, tardy, or leave early, they accrue significant loss of imperative instructional time.

Our campus is open to students and families beginning at 7:15 a.m. daily.

All students that arrive between 7:15 a.m. and 7:45 a.m. will report to the gym except for Kindergarten. Kindergarten reports in the morning to the cafeteria. At 7:30 all students are escorted from the gym and cafeteria to their classrooms.

Our school day begins at 7:45 a.m. Any student that arrives after that time, must be checked in at the front office to receive their tardy slip. Please be aware that absences and tardies affect perfect attendance. Our attendance policy is as follows:

Tardy Procedures

A child will be considered tardy if they arrive after the 7:45 a.m. bell. **All late arrival students must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who will be signing them in for the day. For the purpose of perfect attendance awards, 3 Tardies =1 absence.** When a student reaches 5 tardy's, the teacher will contact the parent to discuss attendance/tardy policies and to collaborate toward a solution.

Early Checkout Policy

Early Checkout Parents cannot pick up their child the last 15 minutes of the day. Leaving school early can be as detrimental to a child's education as being tardy. Please limit your early checkout to necessary appointments such as doctor or dental visits. **Your child will not be eligible for perfect attendance awards if he/she checks out early for reasons other than a medical appointment more than 3 times.** Early-outs will also be evaluated when considering Out-of-District transfer requests and/or renewals.

Parent's Note After an Absence

When a student must be absent from school, the student—upon returning to school—must bring a note, signed by the parent that describes the reason for the absence. **A note does not mean the absence is excused.**

Doctor's Note after an Absence for Illness

Upon return to school, a student absent for more than 3 consecutive days because of a personal illness must bring a statement from a doctor or health clinic verifying the illness or condition that caused the student's extended absence from school. Otherwise, the student's absence may be considered unexcused and, if so, would be considered to be in violation of compulsory attendance laws. Should the student develop a questionable pattern of absences, the principal or Campus Truancy Officer may require a statement from a doctor or health clinic verifying the illness or condition that caused the student's absence from school in order to determine whether the absence or absences will be excused or unexcused.


