Complete Your Annual Volunteer Training

If you are coming to HFE to volunteer in ANY capacity, be sure to complete the Fulton County Schools <u>volunteer training</u>. You may not enter the school to volunteer without having completed this training, which consists of a video and a short quiz. You will then receive a confirmation email that your training is complete. If after a day or two you do not receive the confirmation email, please follow up with FCS as you may not yet be cleared to volunteer. We are so happy to have volunteers at school and do not want you to get turned away!

Set Up Your Infinite Campus Account

The Infinite Campus parent portal, Campus Parent, provides access to information for all enrolled students in your household. HFE Student Government - Application Deadline 9/25

No Place For Hate - Application Deadline 9/29

Heards Ferry has been officially designated as a <u>No Place For Hate</u> school for the last three school years and is very excited to announce that it will be growing and improving its NPHF efforts this year. No Place for Hate is a collaborative initiative that provides PreK–12 schools with an organizing framework for students, administrators, teachers, and families to develop long-term solutions

for creating an inclusive and equitable climate, for taking a stand against bias and bullying, and for sending a clear, unified message that all students have a place where they belong.

If your 4th grade student is interested in applying for the No Place for Hate Coalition (NPFH), please have them fill out an application <u>here</u>. The deadline to apply is Friday, September 29th. This is a two-year commitment (4th & 5th grade). Six fourth grade students will be selected to be a part of the coalition, which also consists of eight 5th grade students. Monthly meetings will be held the second Friday of the month during Team Time (7:40-8:10).



Under the leadership of Ms. Aronowitz, Ms. McKernan, Ms. McCullough, and Ms. Brenner, the "No Place for Hate Coalition" will conduct activities to sustain an inclusive school environment such as a "No Place For Hate" pledge, Kindness Week, anti-bias classroom counseling lessons and Diversity Reader Week. Reminder: Participate Remote Days

Having our students in school each and every day is a priority for us here at HFE. We want to share with you information about Participate Remote Days.

Approved Remote Learning Days are a new addition to the Fulton County attendance policy as of last year. Each student is able to take up to 5 approved remote learning days each semester. These can be used when you have a special family event, required travel, etc. These days must be requested at least 5 days in advance and require principal's approval. These days may not be used on testing days. Here is how the process works:

- Parent notifies homeroom teacher of request to take remote learning days.
- Teacher will provide link to form requesting remote learning days.
- Teachers will provide work for students to complete within 5 days of the absence.
