November: National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Month

In the School District of Beloit, we have 254 students identified as being homeless. The pandemic has also been a struggle for many of our families living without electricity, heat, or who may have had to find alternative living arrangements in tents and cars. Ms. Robin Stuht, our Homeless Liaison, is reaching out to all our families to see if they can help us take care of our homeless students and families during National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Month.

Ms. Stuht works directly with our homeless students and our struggling families and knows what can help them through this unprecedented time. Update on Board of Education Meeting on Tuesday, October 27:

A few weeks ago, I asked our teachers and administrators to participate in a Distance Learning survey. I wanted to get a feel and pulse check on how things were going and ask for feedback. As part of that survey, 80% of our administrators and 59.9% of our classroom teachers shared that under the right conditions, they would be in favor of having small groups of students (less than 10) have access to learning in the classroom.

I was able to share this update with the Board of Education at their meeting last week. They were supportive of the District exploring small groups of students in our buildings. I am committed to analyzing the possible scenario of small groups of students working collaboratively with our staff.

No decision has been made at this time. I will keep you updated on any progress we are making in working towards this goal in my weekly letters.
