

Principal's Message

Dear Woodmoor Families,

I hope this communication finds you well! We have had a very different start to the new year with weather related closures and COVID related illnesses and such.

As you are now aware per Dr. Reid's communication to families, several of our middle and high schools will transition to remote learning starting Jan. 13th- Jan 24th. As of today, there have been no elementary schools transitioning to remote learning. Therefore, Woodmoor will remain open for in person learning. If such a transition to remote needs to happen for our school, you will be communicated directly from the district and the school. Please read the following excerpt from Dr. Reid's communication to help you better understand the details regarding if we had to pause in person learning:

"If **a school** needs to close, the plan would be for it to remain closed for 10 calendar days before reopening. That would mean two days for teachers to prepare and eight more days. There are grade-level appropriate plans for both synchronous and asynchronous activities and lessons for students on the two planning days.

I want to stress that staff in all of our schools and departments across the District are working hard to keep the District open – some are working around the clock. At this time, our intent is to continue in-person learning, while we make decisions on a school-by-school basis about pausing in-person learning as necessary due to health and safety concerns or available staffing levels."

I know there are so many changes to keep up with and to process, but know that we will all get through this together. At Woodmoor, we will continue to follow our COVID prevention procedures and protocols to keep students safe to the best of our abilities. We appreciate your understanding and flexibility as we continue to navigate batch testing and COVID positive cases. If you should have any specific COVID related questions after attending Dr. Reid's webinar today, please reach out to our COVID Supervisor, Sam Ramirez @ sramirez@nsd.org and he can answer any questions you might have.





Covid Updates

In support of student and family safety, we want to say thank you to all who are participating in batch testing to slow the spread of COVID-19. This testing allows us to be able to isolate positive cases and keep our staff and students in school. It is our goal to provide strong communication around safety protocols and procedures; part of this transparent communication includes notification in the event of a positive COVID test of a person here on campus.

Those students who are confirmed fully vaccinated and have given permission for Reflex/PCR testing are able to stay at school while waiting for their Reflex/PCR test results (test to stay protocol). We are able to Reflex/PCR test students at school who are confirmed fully vaccinated and have parent/guardian permission. To give permission for your confirmed fully vaccinated student to be Reflex/PCR tested at school please register here.

Those students who are not confirmed fully vaccinated will not be able to return to Woodmoor until they have received a negative confirmatory PCR test. These confirmatory tests are offered by the Northshore School District at Pop Keeney Field free of charge. Once we know who has tested positive, we will begin contact tracing and notify those who are determined to be close contacts as defined within the Department of Health K-12 school requirements. Any individual with COVID-19 will not be able to return to the building until after their contagious period has passed. Learn more about response protocols here.

Close Contact Students NOT fully vaccinated

Non-fully vaccinated students must quarantine for a minimum of 14 days, unless after 5 days, they take a PCR test which shows negative results. The student may return to class after 7 full days of isolation, with documentation a negative test, and assuming they have not developed any symptoms.

Close Contract Students who ARE fully

<u>vaccinated</u> may continue to attend school and monitor for symptoms. Although it is recommended, a Covid19 test is not required but encouraged after 5 days of exposure. If symptoms develop, a negative PCR test will be required to return to school.


Next PTSA General Meeting February 1st @ 7pm
