### **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:**

#### **MATH CLASSES**

#### **Algebra Skills**

### Grade Level: Any student taking Algebra 1 next year

Want to be more successful in every math class? Algebra Skills can get you there! We'll review algebraic equations, terminology of algebra, word problems, factoring, slope-intercept, and gain confidence to support future math course endeavors.

# Advanced Math Skills Grade Level: Any student taking Algebra 2 or PreCalc next vear

Does it seem like you took algebra 1 way too long ago? Even though you were using algebra skills throughout your geometry class, you may want to brush up on them to prepare for your algebra 2 or PreCalc class next year. This class will quickly review basic skills that are necessary to know going into Algebra 2 or PreCalc as well as focus on the introductory topics you will be seeing this coming school year. PreCalc students will learn polynomials, logarithmic and exponential functions, evaluating trigonometric functions, rationals, and more.

### **Geometry Prep**

#### **Grade Level: Any student taking Geometry next year**

Sizes, shapes, angles and dimensions: all of these topics await you in geometry next year. This course will review algebra skills necessary to succeed as well as cover introductory topics that you will be seeing in your geometry course this coming school year.

# SAT Math Prep Open to all students

Taking the SAT in the future? Come and join us to learn strategies you can use on the SAT math section to help you increase your score and get into the dream college! This class helps students to focus on exactly the areas they need to work on most.

#### **OTHER ENRICHMENT CLASSES**

### Conversational Spanish Open to all students

No matter if you have

little or no experience with the study and use of Spanish, this course will introduce you to vocabulary, grammar, and culture to help you prepare for your first year of Spanish.

Students will engage in real-life communicative situations starting with listening and speaking activities as well as exploring Hispanic customs to assist in reinforcing language skills.

### Study Skills Open to all students

Ever feel like you are not performing at your best? Need some assistance maximizing your efforts? Reflective practices used in this course will engage students in strengthening skill sets as well as self awareness. Students will work to identify academic strengths and weaknesses; and then individually address those areas to maximize efforts and academic success.

#### **READING AND WRITING CLASSES**

### Reading and Writing Across Disciplines Open to all Students

Improve your reading and writing skills to excel in all of your classes. The course focuses on developing critical thinking, analytical, and communication skills through the examination of different types of texts across multiple disciplines. This is a valuable course for students who want to become more proficient readers and writers.

# Summer Reading Prep Open to all students

Summer Reading Prep allows students to work on their summer assignments with teacher guidance. This summer course is available for students taking the following courses next year: English I, English IH, English II, English IIH, English III, English IV. We will discuss reading strategies, as well as review characters and plot points from students' selected summer text. While focusing on the summer reading book, students will be building reading, writing, discussion, presentation, and group work skills. This course lets you walk into Day 1 of your 2023-2024 school year feeling prepared and confident!

### Writing Skills for English Language Arts Open to all students

This will be a workshop-style course that allows students to practice writing, revising, and utilizing teacher feedback. We will focus on brainstorming, outlining, writing for a variety of purposes (persuasive, literary analysis, research, etc.), reading rubrics, and presenting written work. Students will also work on writing skills for purposes outside of the traditional 5-paragraph essay, such as composing emails, crafting letters, and answering short response questions on assessments.

#### **HISTORY CLASSES**

### Advanced History Analysis Grade Level: Incoming 10th- 12th graders

Studying U.S. History is not only identifying dates and people, but the implementation of crucial skills necessary to get to the core of events to fully understand them. In this course, students will expand their Social Studies skills through examination of historical documents and engaging in chronological thinking. Students will develop writing and skills to be prepared to examine history in a different manner.

# Writing for Freshmen in History Grade Level: Incoming 8th and 9th graders

Now is your chance to learn everything you'll need to know in order to be successful for your freshman year history course! In this course, you'll learn how to write better essays, take effective notes, read/ outline informative texts, and practice research skills, including MLA citation format.
