Technology Reminders

Our network security team conducts regular checks to identify compromised devices, including those that may have been hacked or reset to factory settings. Resetting devices is a **severe breach** of our digital security protocols. This action bypasses the security and filtering settings that the district has implemented for the safety and security of our network. Engaging in such activities is classified as a Tier 3 offense under Rule 18h (Tamper/Phish/Hack District Network) of the Code of Conduct.



Remind your student to adhere to the Device User Agreement (page 73 in the 2023-2024 Code of Conduct <u>HERE</u>) when using school technology. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in disciplinary actions. It is crucial that we work together to ensure the responsible use of our technology resources.

We encourage you to discuss this with your children and remind them of the importance of using technology appropriately. Your support in this matter is vital in maintaining a secure and conducive learning environment for all students.

In addition to Rule 18h of the Code of Conduct, this is also a reminder about cell phones and smart watches. Rule 18f.II states that the use of Personal Communication Devices (cell phones, smart watches, recording devices) is not allowed in grades Pk–5. If a student's personal communication device is confiscated by school personnel, it will only be released to the parent or guardian who must come to the school to retrieve the device.
