Hello Chapman's Families,

We have officially started school and we are thrilled to be back in the school routine. Hopefully, your children have worked through any technology glitches, connected with their classmates, and dug into their curriculums. I am so proud of our staff and students this week. As I popped into zoom sessions, I saw students ask questions, complete work online, and work together, and teachers using new technology like pros.

We can't wait to see our K-2 students in the building on Monday! We realize this may be a little challenging on the first day since parents are not allowed in the building. We will have many staff members available to walk students directly to their rooms. If you have a specific concern, please contact your teacher so they will be aware that your child may benefit from additional support. Hopefully, our kindergarten students will already be familiar with their teacher and will be excited to come into the building.

The district has approved for students to use playground equipment, since it is not a contained indoor space. We will continue to follow social distancing guidelines and encourage hand washing as students return to their classrooms. Students will continue to eat lunch in their classrooms, and teachers will transition instead of students. Masks will be required while on school grounds. Students may remove them during snack, lunch, and recess, and during specific times per teacher directive (small breaks, etc.).

This has been an extremely challenging period for our school district, teachers, families, and community. We are committed to doing everything we can to keep your children safe, keep our staff safe, and educate our students. Thank you for your ongoing support, recommendations, and kind words. I also want to thank our PTO for keeping our staff well fed, answering parent questions, keeping our CRES PTO site up to date, and the myriad of things they do for us on a daily basis.

- Use data to address the needs of the students
- Deliver classroom guidance
- Facilitate Small groups
- Individual counseling
- Facilitate parent workshops and small groups
- Attend parent teacher conferences, IEP meetings, and coordinate/attend 504 meetings
