



ELEMENTARY COUNSELING

CORNER

Hello Woodmoor Families!

The month of November can be a good time to focus on gratitude. Gratitude is a great way to support our mental and emotional health. When we take the time to think about all of the people and things we appreciate, it can help us feel happier and build better relationships with others. It is okay to still feel sad or angry about problems in our lives, but gratitude can help us recognize the good things we have and help others feel good too!

Throughout November your students have been hearing gratitude reminders from the morning announcements. These give students ideas of who and what they can be grateful for and how they can show their gratitude. I hope this will help your students learn more about how gratitude helps themselves and others!

Classroom Lessons

I have had the fantastic opportunity to teach in many of your students' classrooms this year. In kindergarten and 1st grade I have been reading stories about feelings and friendship. In 2nd-5th grade we have been focused on problem solving with peers. I used a lesson from Sanford Harmony that explains how different people handle conflict by using animals as examples:

- A turtle is someone who chooses to hide their feelings and not share what they think. Sometimes it can be good to walk away when a situation is unsafe or when emotions are running high, but often it is important to share how we feel so that others can help us.
- A shark on the other hand is someone who choose to express their feelings in a scary way to get what they want. They might not want to listen to others' ideas and might yell or hurt others when they don't get their way.
- An owl is someone who looks out for other people and tries to find solutions that work for everyone. They are comfortable with sharing how they feel but know how to do it in a respectful way. I encouraged the classes I taught to try to be owls, and future lessons will focus on how they can resolve conflicts effectively.

Hello Woodmoor Families,

My name is Sarah Hoff. I am the new Mental Health Specialist for the Northshore Elementary Schools in the South Region. I have worked as a mental health counselor for the past 3 years, and prior to that I did behavioral support and case management for children ages birth to 10. As a mental health specialist, my role will be to provide more intensive one-on-one mental health support to students to support their social-emotional development and learning at school, and to support children whose issues outside of the school day are impacting their behavior and functioning at school. I will be seeing students during 30-minute counseling sessions during the school day, scheduled for times that disrupt their learning as little as possible. Please talk to your child's teacher or school counselor if this is something you are interested in for your child. Looking forward to working with you.
