Dear Families:

As I reflect on the tragic events that took place at Margory Stoneman Douglas High School in Florida last month, and my own feelings both as a parent and a principal, the safety and security of our children at East Ridge has constantly been on my mind.

If you have children in middle school or high school, or if you read Dr. Reid's recent communication, you likely know that many secondary students are planning a 17-minute walkout on March 14 to express their views on school safety and recognize the student lives lost in Florida. In secondary schools, the walkouts have been initiated and planned by students. The walkouts are serving as real-life lessons in civics and civil disobedience. Students who will soon be considered adults have some knowledge and understanding of recent school shootings and are using their voices and actions to engage in this national issue.

Most elementary students at East Ridge are in a different place than middle and high school students, with many unaware that school violence is a reality in our world. Rather than engaging in schoolwide activities on March 14, we will carry on with our regular school day. Teachers will not initiate discussions about guns, violence or walkouts. As a principal, I recognize that some families may be talking about these topics with their children. I want to support student or family action that is organized, meaningful, safe and school appropriate. If you or your child wants to participate in the walkout on the 14th, I ask that you please come to the school, sign out your child, go to the designated area (East Ridge Friendship Garden), supervise your child, and then sign your child back in at the conclusion of the walkout. Conversations around these tragic real-life events can be very confusing and cause anxiety in the young children we serve. Please help your child respect that many other students don't know about school gun violence and their families would like it to stay that way for now.

When it comes to addressing school threats and violence, we do everything we can to be proactive and responsive when needed. However, when it is happening out in the world around us at such an egregious level, it is always difficult to know the best response for everyone impacted because senseless violence is hard for everyone, especially kids, to process. If your child is struggling with recent events, please let us know. We want to help. It is important to validate their feelings both at school and at home. Discussions about school safety cannot be ignored. Over the last few years we have worked to make safety improvements at East Ridge, and we work continuously with our Safety & Emergency Preparation Team to review and revise our procedures as district directives and budgets allow. Our staff receives annual

training around our safety and security protocols. This year all staff attended an Active Threat training and will be receiving additional Safe Schools training later this month. Our school safety team meets to review our emergency plans and we routinely conduct drills which prepare our staff to keep our children safe. East Ridge is dedicated to working closely with our district team in the upcoming months to review our school safety plans and procedures. As a result of training and review of our safety procedures, here are some important things we are doing at East Ridge:

"Ready-Locked" Doors

Our classroom doors are now kept in a "ready-lock" position. This is the protocol the district has proposed until further security updates are installed. A "ready-lock" position for a classroom door means one of the following:

- The door is locked, but there is a magnet placed on the strike plate to keep it from engaging. The handle will feel as though it is locked, but when you pull, the door will open. The magnet on the strike plate can be removed quickly, allowing the door to be locked immediately without a key.
- Some classrooms may choose to always have a locked door and establish procedures for students, additional staff, or parent volunteers to enter the room with minimal interruption to instruction.

All doors are locked when teachers and students leave the classroom, to prevent unauthorized entry when a teacher is not present.

Staff and Visitor Identification

It is important at all times for everyone to identify who is on campus at East Ridge. A badge (school badge, district badge, guest badge, or visitor sticker) signifies that the adult has signed in at the office and belongs at our school at that time. We have now trained all staff and students to be on the lookout for adults without badges. Staff know to greet a person without a badge, ask them to report to the office to sign in, then immediately follow up with a phone call to report the person to the office. Students know to let a staff member know if they see an adult on campus without a badge. Students also know to remind staff to wear their badges! Visitors to our campus need to know the following:

- A visitor is anyone who is not an East Ridge student or staff member.
- No visitors are to approach a classroom if they do not have a visitor badge.
- ▶ Before, during, or after the school day, all visitors must sign in if they plan to enter any area of campus other than the parent pickup/drop off area at the front of the school. This includes assemblies, walking a child to the classroom, or dropping something off to a classroom before or after school.
- All visitors must sign in at the office and wear a visitor badge at all times.
- Visitors who are not recognized by office staff will be asked to show proof of identification in the form of picture ID.
- Classroom volunteers must have a current Washington State Patrol Background Check on file in the office. Check with office staff if you need a form or need to check on your status.

Emotional safety is also important! In our last newsletter, you read about all of the actions we are taking to increase the percentage of students who feel safe, have a sense of belonging, personally meaningful friendships, and who believe that their school is vibrant and inclusive, with rules that are fair and equitable. During the last two weeks, all of our students took a survey that helps us know how our students are feeling about all of these aspects of well-being at school. On this survey, we offered the opportunity to have students share their name at the end of the survey (this was optional). Now, as we review the data, we have the opportunity to follow up with individuals and groups in order to hear more input and work to improve their feelings about school, their relationships with peers and adults, and their safety. Here are a few things we are also focusing on this month:

This month, our school is focused on the trait of Optimism. Teachers are using read aloud books and classroom activities to promote a positive climate at our school. You can read more about Optimism here: https://www.nsd.org/cms/lib/WA01918953/Centricity/Domain/308/Optimism2.pdf

- This week, all teachers are re-teaching "upstander" strategies. A bystander is someone who sees bullying happening but doesn't know what to do. An upstander is someone who stops bullying by using one or more of these strategies: being a buddy, interrupting, speaking out, and telling an adult. Ask your child what he/she has learned about being an upstander and for examples of how they are using some of these strategies.
- Also, this week, all of our teachers are discussing the importance of "see something, say something." We want our students to know that they should always tell an adult if they see or hear something unsafe.

Please know that your child's physical and emotional safety and security are always in the forefront of my heart and my mind. I am committed to working with our district administration, our school staff, and our families to ensure that all of our children have a safe, welcoming place to learn and grow each day.

 students at recess.
- Both of our new playground equipment boxes have been broken into. These boxes allow us to store more equipment for play at recess and save instructional time by making it quick to take out and put away.




