Tardy Policy and Procedures

Our campus is open to students and families beginning at 7:15 a.m. daily.

Our school day begins at 7:45 a.m. Any student that arrives after that time, must be checked in at the front office by a parent or adult to receive their tardy slip. Please be aware that absences and tardies affect perfect attendance. Our attendance policy is as follows:

Tardy Procedures

A child will be considered tardy if they enter the building after the 7:45 a.m. bell. **All late arrival students must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who will be signing them in for the day. For the purpose of perfect attendance awards, 3 tardies =1 absence.** When a student reaches 5 tardies, the teacher will contact the parent to discuss attendance/tardy policies and to collaborate toward a solution.

Beginning **Monday, November 4th**, if your student arrives to campus after 7:45 a.m., you will be directed to park in the parking lot and walk your child inside to receive a tardy slip from the office.

Car drop-off lines between 7:15-7:30 a.m. are minimal. Plan to arrive early to ensure your child is not missing valuable instructional minutes each day.

Helpful Tips for AWESOME ATTENDANCE

- Remind your child that school is their first and most important job! Tardies and early release times can count as "parts of days".
- Communicate the importance of regular school attendance to your child so they are hearing the same thing at home that we are saying at school.
- If your child has a doctor/dentist appointment, he or she can still come to school before and after their appointment.
- If your student is running a fever, vomiting, or has diarrhea, he or she needs to be kept home. If she or he does not have any of these symptoms, please send him or her to school.

At 8 a.m. on Thursday, October 31st, we will have our Storybook Character Parade. All costumes need to be associated with a book. This can be a book that students bring with them on that day, from the library, or one they write themselves, but all costumes must be accompanied by a book. No masks, face paint, or scary/bloody/gory costumes please. Students should bring a change of clothes if their outfit will not allow for classroom learning and physical activity afterward. Parents wishing to just view the parade may enter through the front cafeteria doors for seating in the cafeteria to view the parade procession. You will not need to sign in through the office for this. These guests will then exit those same doors, not having access to the building. If you are volunteering for Fall Fest on that day

as well, you should plan to come to the office prior to the parade to show your ID at the front office to receive your visitor/volunteer badge.

Rancho Thanksgiving Lunch Event

Rancho families and friends, we invite you all to our annual Thanksgiving luncheon on Wednesday, November 20th. We invite you to come join in the festivities and enjoy lunch with your child. More information will be coming home today in your student's take home folder.

We encourage you to pre-purchase your meal ticket for that day so that we can be prepared with enough for everyone and you will be able to skip the ticket line. Ticket information is in your child's folder. If you unable to pre-purchase, there will be a ticket sales table on the day of the event. To expedite our process of checking family and friends in for school events and class parties, Rancho will continue to use our Google RSVP "Fast Pass" system. Before any large school event or class party, an RSVP "Fast Pass" form will be sent out for you to fill out via email and parent newsletter. Filling out the form allows us to have your visitor badge pre-printed prior to the event and ready for you when you arrive. This allows you to enter quickly by just showing your ID.

In order to use the Fast Pass, your I.D. must must have been scanned into our school system this year. If your ID has not been scanned into our system this school year, you may want to drop by before the party or event to scan it and expedite your entry. **You must have your ID on the event** day regardless if your badge is pre-printed or not. LHISD policy is **"NO ID, No Entry".** However, the RSVP process will speed along your entry.
