#### Principal's Message

It's hard to believe, but we are already mid-way through the first quarter. It is a great time to talk with your student(s) about their grades. You can easily do this by logging into Q at https://parentconnect.asdk12.org/production/parentportal and clicking the assignments button. You will see your child's grades, graded assignments, and missing work if they have any. Elementary school is about learning, growing, and developing good habits and attitudes. If your child is struggling, please talk to the teacher to create a plan to support them.

Parent-teacher conferences are coming up on October 23rd and 24th. Be on the lookout for an invitation to sign up. Please prioritize making these conferences. It is an important time to communicate and collaborate with your child(ren)'s teacher.

All students have completed assessments in reading and math. We use the results to provide targeted instruction to your children both in the regular classroom and during WIN (What I Need) time. We had no parent refusals to take these assessments this fall. Thank you! This is valuable information that we put to good use to improve outcomes for all of our students.

In addition to using this information to provide targeted instruction to our students, we also use it to reflect on what's working and what isn't to improve our practices. Great news, it is working! On our MAP Growth reading assessment, we went from a schoolwide median score of 44th %ile in the fall of 2022, to the 50th %ile in 2023, to the 62nd %ile this fall. On our MAP Growth math assessment, we went from a schoolwide median score of 42nd %ile in the fall of 2022, to the 46th %ile in 2023, to the 52nd %ile this fall. These are very impressive gains our students, staff, and families have achieved together.

I look forward to continuing this partnership to provide the very best education to all students at Ocean View. Please feel free to reach out to your child's teacher or me whenever you need us.

#### Ocean View 3/4 & 5th Battle of the Books


We will soon be starting 3/4th and 5th Battle of the Books meetings soon! The Battle of the Books is a statewide Alaskan reading motivation and comprehension program sponsored by the Alaska Association of School Librarians. The program encourages and recognizes students who enjoy reading while broadening reading interests, increasing reading comprehension, and promoting academic excellence. In Anchorage, students in grades 3-12 have the opportunity to compete at the district level in the hopes of representing ASD at the state level competition.

Each year, ten titles are carefully chosen by a committee; these titles must meet a set of defined criteria that ensures that the list is balanced in many different ways. Students then independently read the books carefully, as well as memorize complete titles and author(s), which is how points are awarded during the competition. Students are not required to read all books.

After-school practices will focus on the memorization of titles and authors and getting used to the competition procedures. Initially we will be meeting weekly for one hour after school, when we get closer to the competition, we will increase to meeting twice weekly after school. For this semester, meetings will take place on Mondays - 2:30-3:30pm for 5th grade and Thursdays for 3rd/4th grade in the library.

Practices will begin the week of September 30th. Parental permission is required to participate in this after-school program. Interested students can pick up an informational letter with permission slip and a complete list of this year's Battle of the Books. ## AK Star and the Alaska Science Assessment Student-Level Results 2024

In the spring of 2024, students in grades 3-9 participated in the Alaska System of Academic Readiness (AK STAR) or Alternate Assessment (AA) state summative assessments in English Language arts and mathematics. Students in grades 5, 8 and 10 took the Alaska Science Assessment or Alternate Assessment (AA) in science. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide information to parents, educators, policy makers, communities and businesses about how Alaska's schools and districts are performing, along with an overall picture of an individual student's progress in meeting State of Alaska standards at grade level.

Parents will be provided student-level electronic results on Friday, September 27.

To view your child's AK STAR/Alaska Science Assessment or Alternate Assessment results:

For English language arts, math and science, each student will receive an overall score that is aligned to one of four achievement levels: Proficient (P), Advanced (A), Approaching Proficient (AP) and Needs Support (NS).

Please remember that AK STAR, the Alaska Science Assessment and the Alternate Assessment are not pass/fail tests. AK STAR and the Alaska Science Assessment are aligned to the Alaska State Standards and the scores provide information to guide decision-making and support students on their path to success. Alaska's standards and assessments ensure our students are academically ready to succeed in the community, workplace, post-secondary training, the military and college. The Anchorage School District maintains high learning expectations for all students and is committed to preparing students for success in life.

#### Reporting Process for Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying

The School Board revised Policy 5131.43 on September 3, to require at least once per semester that students, parents, guardians, and staff members be informed of all available options for reporting concerns of harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including an option to report concerns anonymously. In compliance with this policy, principals should share the following information with their staff, students, and families:

The Anchorage School District is dedicated to providing a safe and civil learning environment. Harassment, intimidation, and bullying disrupt a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate. Students and staff are expected to consistently demonstrate respectful conduct and communication to ensure safe learning environments for all.

If a student experiences, or another person observes, a student being harassed, intimidated, or bullied, they should report it to a school administrator or through <u>STOPit</u> anonymous reporting.

This <u>Harassment, Intimidation & Bullying flier</u> outlines the reporting process.
