

The History of Black History Month

In 1926 Carter G. Woodson and Jesse E. Moorland sponsored Negro History Week during the second week in February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglas. During the Civil Rights Movement it expanded to a month-long celebration and was officially recognized in 1976 by Gerald Ford "to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history."
