A MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL STACY PERLMAN

Hello Mountain Park Families!

We hope everyone is having a fantastic summer! We are busy preparing for the 2019-2020 school year! Our theme this year is **Be Kind** and you will see it woven throughout the year. We are excited about the gains we made last year, especially in 5th grade ELA, math and science. Our focus this year will be on continuing the work we've started and ensuring that students have meaningful and engaging learning experiences. Here's what we've been working on:

Effective English Language Arts Instruction:

We will continue implementing the Lucy Calkins' Reading and Writing Units of Study K-5. It is critical that our students are strong readers and effective writers. We believe (and have the data to prove) that the Readers' and Writers' Workshop model is the right way to achieve this. Here 3rd graders share their best writing with visitors at an author's celebration.

Schoolwide Enrichment Model (SEM) & TAG (Talented and Gifted):

We are continuing to implement our Charter initiative with the Enrichment Block. All students participate in a daily 50 minute Enrichment Block for science and social studies instruction. The TAG students go to TAG classes for this block. ALL students are engaged in project-based, hands-on learning. Teachers have developed engaging and rigorous learning units to teach the science and social studies standards. Most of the students call it PBL (Project-Based Learning) and say it's their favorite subject!



Three years ago we piloted the Engage New York math curriculum in one 1st grade class. The results were compelling so we implemented in all first grades the following year. Last year

we rolled this curriculum up to 2^{nd} grade as well. The 2^{nd} grade teachers were so happy with their students' progress in math that we are expanding to K and 3^{rd} in 2019-2020.

Professional Learning Communities:

We will continue iterating our PLC prototype. Our teams meet together weekly to review student data and student work. Our two CSTs, Dr. Keogh (ELA) and Ms. Smith (Math & Enrichment Block) will continue to work with our teams to make sound instructional decisions based on student progress.

Design Thinking

We are in our 7th year as part of the AK12DC (Atlanta K-12 Design Challenge), a consortium of public and private schools working to incorporate design thinking in schools. We continue to collaborate with leadership from the Lovett School and The Westminster Schools, as well as other schools within Fulton County. Last year our 5th grade design team won a national competition for their prototype to solve the problem of homelessness.

MPE teachers and students use this innovative strategy to solve problems and engage in higher order thinking through the design thinking cycle of empathize, define, ideate, prototype and test. We also have the opportunity to be supported by Scott Sanchez, a professor at the Stanford dSchool who mentors us in this work. The Dobbs Foundation is funding a case study of Mountain Park and our work with design thinking. Wendy Kelly and I will also be presenting our work at the Learning Forward conference in St. Louis in December. Here is an article about design thinking at MPE: <u>https://bit.ly/2IRaH4q</u>

Technology

Mountain Park is part of the Fulton County Personalized Learning Initiative. Each homeroom class has district provided iPads for student use. We have supplemented those with our school and PTA purchased iPads to provide more access in the 3-5 classrooms. Students are able to use electronic resources to work at their own pace, create products and conduct research. Students in grades 3-5 are also welcome to bring their own technology to school if they sign and follow our B.Y.O.T. agreement. We anticipate a technology refresh this fall and the MPE Foundation is working hard to raise money to provide additional devices to those provided by the district.

SEM AND PROJECT-BASED LEARNING Learn to Think! Think to Learn!

PE students are highly engaged in hands-on, project-based learning during our daily 50-minute Enrichment Block. Students learn science and social studies concepts through our Schoolwide Enrichment Model (SEM) in TAG and general education classes daily.

The Schoolwide Enrichment Model was developed by renowned educational psychologist Dr. Joseph Renzulli (University of Connecticut). The SEM model infuses higher level thinking activities and more opportunities for creativity into every classroom. Project-Based Learning (PBL) is a highly engaging and motivating approach that draws student involvement, interest, and investment in learning. By combining the project-based approach and SEM strategies, student engagement and learning soar!

What opportunities does the Schoolwide Enrichment Model provide for students?

We are very lucky to have a very active and healthy PTA at Mountain Park. We could only do that with the support of our amazing volunteers, parents, staff and students! Through our Annual PTA Membership Drive and Holiday Extravaganza Fundraiser we fund 90% of our PTA programs including Family Fun Night, Classroom & Clinic Supplies, Educational Software and Resources, Youth Day Parade Float, Facility Enhancement, Staff Appreciation Events and much more.

The majority of the money raised through the purchase of a membership is used for the Schoolwide Enrichment Model (SEM) program The Schoolwide Enrichment Model (SEM) is a unique learning model at MPE. Through the support of our PTA, MPE students are able to participate in daily hands-on Project Based Learning opportunities. SEM dollars provide additional materials for experiments, book clubs, on site field trips, guest speakers, supplies for learning spaces, digital content, culminating activities like Lemonade Wars and Pioneer Day, and creative opportunities to enhance learning. Approximately \$30.00 is spent on each student every year to enrich learning through the Schoolwide Enrichment Model .

The PTA's goal is to raise \$24,000 through our Annual Membership Drive to meet the need for \$30.00 per student for SEM. CIRCLE OF FRIENDS AND LUNCH BUNCH

ountain Park provides inclusive programs to meet the needs of students with varied learning styles and characteristics. At Mountain Park, the goal of special education is to prepare students through specialized instruction to become successful in all educational and social settings. Regular education students may have the opportunity to participate in "Circle of Friends" on a volunteer basis with parental permission.

The purpose of Circle of Friends is to include typical peers in therapy as peer models to help cue and teach other students social skills throughout the school day in all settings. In the end, Circle of Friends teaches all students the value and gift of individual differences. This program promotes understanding and tolerance which fosters relationships and friendships in a therapy setting facilitated by a Speech Language Pathologist. This program also promotes weekly opportunities to verbally extend invitations to a few classmates to attend lunch in a supervised classroom known as "Lunch Bunch." Many social skill topics are taught and role played such as the importance of having good manners, conversational skills, problem solving skills, and interactive social role play situations. Countless research demonstrates the effectiveness of using peer-mediated strategies to promote social

TALENTED AND GIFTED (TAG)

The Talented and Gifted (TAG) program in the Fulton County School System provides enriching learning experiences for the intellectually advanced and exceptionally creative student.

Gifted services are available in all Fulton County schools for students in kindergarten through grade 12.


The program meets all requirements of the Georgia Department of Education and provides diverse, high-quality opportunities for the student. All TAG teachers in Fulton County hold an endorsement in Gifted Education from the Professional Standards Commission. These specially-trained educators guide the gifted student in ways that maximize the child's unique learning characteristics, interests, personal needs, and capabilities.

The Fulton County School System screens students for eligibility for gifted services twice a year.

TRANSPORTATION TIPS & FAQS

Doors open at 7:10AM and the bell rings at 7:40AM. Dismissal begins at 2:20PM.

t Open House, you will choose a primary mode of transportation for your child – the way he or she will go home each day –unless you send in a WRITTEN transportation change. Transportation notepads are available from PTA at Open House. E-mails will not be accepted because staff members don't always have time to check their emails during instructional time.

We recommend that students ride the bus each day; (students who ride the bus are never marked tardy!) You can also take advantage of Here Comes the Bus: an easy-to-use website and mobile app that enables parents and caregivers to view the real-time location of their child's bus on a computer, tablet, or smart phone. Additionally, email alerts and push notifications help parents send their students to the bus stop at just the right time.



To get started, download the Here Comes the Bus app or visit <u>www.herecomesthebus.com</u>, and click the sign up button. Enter in the school code - **87428** - and click "Next" followed by "Confirm." Complete the "User Profile" box, and then under "My Students" click "Add." Enter in your child's last name and student id number (lunch number). Once you confirm our information, you're ready to begin using Here Comes the Bus!

TRANSPORTATION FAQS

- **Q:** What if I need to checkout my child early?
- A: Please arrive in the front office PRIOR to 2:00 PM and be prepared to show a photo ID. Do not park in the bus lane (the lane in front of the school) or the lower parking lot after 2:00 PM or you will likely be stuck there until after dismissal.
- **Q:** How does morning carpool work?
- A: Students may be dropped off after 7:10 AM. Pull in the first entrance to the school, when coming from Hwy 92, and adults will greet your students at the side door, near the 4th and 5th grade wing of the building. Adults are on hand to greet and assist students. Cars MERGE as you near the front of the line. If it is after 7:40 AM, you must pull around; you must park and walk your child in to the front office.
- **Q**: What is the procedure if we park at the front of the school in the morning?
- A: In the mornings, please make sure to pull into an actual spot in the lower or upper parking lot and walk your child to the front of the school. If you would not like to get out of your car, please go through carpool. With buses and cars arriving at the front, and many dark mornings, this helps us ensure student safety.

- **Q:** What about afternoon carpool?
- A: Students are dismissed out of the carpool door beginning at approximately 2:20 PM. Cars MERGE at the entrance to form a line and wait for students. The PE teachers will call your child to one of the cones when you arrive near the front of the line.
- **Q:** What if my child needs to go home a different way?
- A: Send in a WRITTEN Transportation Form with the change Transportation pads are available from PTA at Open House.

MOUNTAIN PARK ELEMENTARY STUDENT SAFETY

S tudent safety is our first priority. We have an extensive safely plan with procedures in place to keep students and staff safe in the event of any emergency situation. Here is a brief overview:

EMERGENCY DRILLS

Emergency Drills are practiced monthly. We have soft lockdown, hard lockdown, evacuate, and shelter drills. A soft lockdown is in the event that there is a threat or hazard outside the building while a hard lockdown is in the event that there is a threat or hazard inside the building. Evacuation drills are practiced in the event that students need to move from one location to another, and finally, shelter drills are practiced in the event that severe weather is approaching. Teachers are trained on drill procedures. Drills are timed and are evaluated by administration for efficiency. If we need to tighten up on a procedure, we practice the drill again. Additionally, all of our staff receives active shooter training.

ENTRY TO THE BUILDING

Exterior doors remain locked during the school day. The side door for carpool is opened at 7:10 AM locked at 7:40 AM each morning. Our front door has a buzzer/lock-ing system where visitors are buzzed into the building. The front door is locked at 7:40 AM as well, and the door remains locked for the rest of the day. If you arrive to school after 7:40 AM, please park in the parking lot and walk your child into the building. Our doors are also locked after dismissal, since students are in the building for after school activities.

EMERGENCY BACKPACKS

PTA has provided Emergency Backpacks for each classroom, complete with first aid kit, flashlight, and other necessary items. We also have a defibrillator on-site as well as at least 10 CPR certified staff members.

Obviously, we hope to never use our emergency procedures. However, we do have them in place, and we practice the drills so we are well prepared in the event of an actual emergency. You will receive notices via Blackboard Messenger from Mountain Park and/or Fulton County in the event of any emergency situation. CAMPUS PARENT

This year, Fulton County is getting a new student information system. Campus Parent will replace Home Access Center, starting in July 2019.

Campus Parent is designed to provide real-time access to student information. The easy-to-use design shares student progress so that you can monitor your child. In this platform, parents can browse assignments, review attendance, and see grades. Links will be available on the Fulton County Website (www.fultonschools.org) and new Mountain Park website (www.fultonschools.org/mountainparkes). There is also an app available for your phone.

All parents will create new accounts for this platform. Directions will be sent to all families in July 2019.

Mark your child's personal items with their name in permanent marker.



MPEF provides flexible funding for educational initiatives, with an initial goal of increasing access to technology for our students to a 1:1 device/student ratio. Having more devices available for classroom use will:

- Leverage Office 365, which is already available to all students, but currently requires frequent logging in and out of devices.
- Allow whole-group instruction using the devices.
- Reduce the need for intricate technology-sharing schedules between teachers and grade levels.
- Improve differentiation of instruction across skill levels and learning styles.

Currently, Fulton County provides 10 devices per 30 students. The Foundation plans to increase this to 1:1 over the next several years, beginning with fifth grade and working down to kindergarten. The cost per device is approximately \$500, so the total cost of this goal will be more than \$250,000.



Any parent, guardian or other person having control of a child that has more than 5 unexcused absences*, after being notified by school personnel, will be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to the following penalties: •Fine – not less than \$25.00 and not greater than \$100

- ·Imprisonment not to exceed 30 days
- · Community Service or any combination of such penalties at the discretion of the courts
- · Each day after 5 unexcused absences will constitute a separate offense
- * Additional information on unexcused absences is outlined in the Student Code of Conduct
