This league joins students with and without disabilities and allows them to compete as teammates in basketball games held with other comprehensive high schools in the district. The most recent game was held at Lodi High School with the Lodi Flames taking on the McNair Eagles. Other contests have been held at both Bear Creek and Tokay High. The culminating showcase for all four teams in the district will take place on **Thurs.**, **Feb. 14**, **2019** at Lodi High.

ALL seniors should submit a FAFSA - Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Don't count yourself out! You must submit a FAFSA to be considered for financial aid, including grants, scholarships and loans. Financial aid can help pay costs of 2 and 4-year colleges and career-technical schools.

Seniors and parent(s) must apply for a Federal Student ID prior to filing a FAFSA - https://fsaid.ed.gov/. The FSA ID number allows you to provide an electronic signature on the FAFSA. Find out more at: www.fafsa.ed.gov, www.fafsa.ed.gov, www.calgrants.org.

Families should <u>file a FAFSA as early as possible beginning October 1</u> using 2017 tax information. Early applicants have a better chance of getting maximum grant and scholarship awards. **Current seniors will complete the 2019-20 FAFSA**. (Students may apply for funding for 2019 summer school by filing a 2018-19 FAFSA.) **There is NO cost to apply for financial aid**. **DO NOT PAY ANY FEES TO FILE A FAFSA**.

March 2 – Cal Grant deadline – must file a FAFSA by 3/2 and list a California school **first** to be considered for a Cal Grant. <u>www.calgrants.org</u> <u>www.csac.ca.gov</u> Cal Grants pay \$13,000+ per year.

Scholarships are awarded based on GPA, college plans, hobbies, community service, academics, obstacles overcome, ethnicity, parents' employment, and more. A lot of money is available for students whose career plans do not require a 4-year college degree. There are many high-paying careers that only require an Associates degree or a certificate.




NorCal Science Festival
