Get Involved...

Especially after last year when so many struggled to make connections, it could be really beneficial for your student to take advantage of participating in one of our extracurricular activities. With over 50 clubs to choose from, there's something for everyone! From connecting to others through Student Council, Best Buddies Club, or the Gaming Club, to developing a passion in the arts, science and math, to discovering potential career paths or sharing in each other's hobbies, your student may find a new interest, or better yet, make some new friends. Activities outside of the school day offer a welcome break from studies and homework, allowing students to de-stress and refresh their mind. Balancing a number of commitments can also help to improve a student's time management skills and give them the chance to assume more responsibility. Additionally, colleges and employers like to see involvement in extracurricular activities on applications. Commitments that go beyond what is required in high school show evidence of a student who is well-rounded and has developed the ability to collaborate with others. However, before your child joins a club for every night of the week, understand colleges want to see very specific things from their extracurriculars:

- **1. Longevity:** Although activities help admissions counselors understand your student's interests, they also want to see students who are committed. Think depth vs. breadth. Colleges do not necessarily want to see students in 15 different clubs, they want to see students with strong commitments to clubs and organizations.
- **2. Passion:** Colleges want to have a grasp on who they invite onto their campus, so they look to see where a student's true interest and passions lie.
- **3. Leadership:** Colleges are looking for students who are going to be positive additions to their campus, students who are committed, take initiative, have track records of success, and have the skills needed to be an example to others.

No matter which clubs your student joins, they will have the opportunity to develop important skills and become more self-aware. The more students make of their opportunities to pursue new experiences and develop new skills, the more likely their extracurricular involvement will add value to their high school experience and help them to create happy memories.

### **2021-22 AP EXAM PAYMENTS:**

PaySchools Central will open Monday, October 4 and closes Friday, October 29 for AP Exam payments. Your child's account will show an AP Exam fee for each AP course they are taking. You should pay for the exam(s) that your child wants to take in the spring.

Any exams ordered AFTER College Board's deadline OR exams that are CANCELED/UNUSED will incur a \$40 penalty by College Board.

\*\*Students are required to take the AP exam to earn AP weighted grading of 1.0 credits. Students enrolled in AP classes, but NOT taking the exam, will earn Honors weighted grading of .5 credits. \*\*

## **Exam Registration:**

AP students <u>must</u> register themselves through their College Board accounts for the online AP Classroom associated with <u>each</u> of their AP classes. Teachers have given students a unique "join code" for each class to do that. AP Classroom is an online platform by College Board that offers many resources to support students in exam preparation. This is also how students register for their exams. **If students do not join their online AP Classroom, an exam <u>cannot</u> be ordered for them.** 

Students can go to myap.collegeboard.org to join their online AP Classroom. If students are having an issue with their College Board account, they must contact College Board: 888-225-5427.
