Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

Thank you to everyone who has helped in the start-up of year two! Our PTA amazes me with the amount of time and energy they devote to our school, even in the summer. They have been planning and working in order to help supplement student learning this year with additional experiences as well as help provide support to the front office team and all staff members. While planning for the year ahead, our PTA also helped copy, stuff envelopes, laminate, cut out, decorate, and design/sell spirit wear, to name a few things!! Whether you can volunteer during the day or at home, multiple scientific studies have linked parent volunteering to student success. Whether big or small, any way to volunteer for all of our kids is huge. Thank you in advance for helping our PTA and modeling the importance of volunteering to your student.

You have probably received an email communication from Katy ISD discussing how school safety is currently being enhanced at each campus. This includes the use of our access controlled doors during the school day. Our access control (doorbell and camera) has been relocated to the vestibule of our school. In order to request access to the front office, you will need to press the button on the unit. You will be greeted and asked the nature of your visit. After explanation you will then hold your state issued identification or passport up to the camera so your identity can be double checked (if multiple adults—each person will display their Identification). If you do not have the proper identification you will not be granted access to the school and all communication will be through the access control unit. Even if the person answering personally knows you, she is required to ask the nature of your visit and see your identification. There will be no exceptions. If you are visiting or have an appointment you will present your identification again at the front desk where your identification will be scanned through the Raptor system. While this process may seem cumbersome to some, this is the safest manner to allow public access in our schools. Student

safety is our number one priority. Instructions with pictures will be on display in our vestibule in order to help with this new process.

Additionally, 4th and 5th grade students will be required to wear their student identification/badge while at school. We supply each student with an ID/badge and clip and there is a fee for replacement. 4th and 5th graders may bring a lanyard to wear if they wish but the lanyard must have a break-away connection. For physical safety, identification will be removed when entering the gym for PE or going outside for recess. Students will place their identification badge back on before leaving the gym or coming inside from recess. Students will remove their ID/badge before leaving at the end of the day so that each student has his or her ID/badge the next morning.

Other security measures will be enhanced this year and I will communicate these with you ahead of time. Again, safety is our number one priority. Please contact me if you have any questions about these new procedures.

As we begin a new school year, here are a few important reminders for everyone:

- Firearms are not permitted on campus unless you are a uniformed police officer wearing proper credentials.
- Please do not use roads such as Willowmoor to drop off or pick up students. Also, do not turn around using the intersection at Ash Creek. Both create dangerous hazards. Please use the car rider line for dropping off and picking up students. The side and front parking lots will now be blocked and monitored in the morning and afternoon. To drop off students, please use the car rider line. If you need to enter the building for school business, please let our front drive teacher on duty know and she will let you in. If your student is in a specialized program, please discuss your entrance and exit plan with your teacher, as not all students enter/exit through the car rider line. Thank you for your cooperation.
- Please remember it is law that you not be on your cell phone while driving in a school zone. This includes the student drop off/pick up lane.
- Lunch visitors will begin September 3rd. Lunch visitors are allowed to visit in the cafeteria. Visitors are not allowed to follow a student back to their classroom or to recess. A parent/guardian can be a lunch visitor once per week.
- Changes of transportation must be in writing with parent/guardian signature and received in the office by 2:30pm.
- Students may be picked up from school through 3:15pm. After 3:15pm, students will go home via their normal mode of transportation. This is for the safety of all students. End of day transitions can become hectic for teachers. The cut off time is to ensure each teacher knows exactly how each student is getting home for the day.
