Over my professional career I have spent 17 years as a high school math teacher and basketball coach (11 here at Northwest!), one year as an Assessment Coordinator, four years as an Assistant Principal at West High, and most recently four years as the head principal of Mayberry Middle School. I am entering my 27th year in education and I could not be more excited to be here, in what I consider to be the *premiere* High School in, not only all of Wichita, but the state of Kansas! We have had an amazing start to the school year as we continue our 39-year tradition of ***Pride, Respect, and Excellence***. The vision of Northwest is to make our school one where we “***empower all students with college and career ready skills and challenge all students to achieve their personal best through increased opportunities for success in a global society***”. The heart and soul of what I do as principal on a day to day basis is to assure that we are ***all*** striving to reach this vision; it is my hope that you will join us in this noble endeavor!

School Goals for 2017-18

I would like to share two school-wide goals that we as a staff will focus on this year: one academic and one behavior:

Academic: NWHS will improve college and career readiness through implementation of building identified WICOR (Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading) strategies, emphasizing Inquiry, to improve student learning where ***50% of our students will be in levels 3 or 4 on the Kansas State Assessments***.

Behavior: NWHS will continue to support excellence for ALL students with an emphasis on providing a positive climate by putting student needs first, by holding students and staff accountable, by building positive relationships between staff, students, and parents, and by focusing on maintaining behavioral expectations as outlined in our school-wide behavior plan while ***reducing tardies, chronic absenteeism and office referrals by 5%***.

We will continue to keep these goals in front of us as we move through the school year. The help that you, as parents and families, provide in regard to these goals is critical to our success. Thank you in advance for your partnership with us.

In conclusion, I want to thank parents and families for being part of our greater Northwest Family. Thank you for sending your students to us, for entrusting this great responsibility upon us. Together we will do all that we can to best prepare your students for college or career. Together we will demonstrate ***Pride, Respect and Excellence*** in all that we do!

You are encouraged to join us for Parent Teacher Conferences at Northwest in the Commons on Monday, September 25 or Wednesday, September 27 from 4:15-7:30 p.m. This is a good time to connect with your student's teachers and talk about his/her progress.

Secure Entrance Procedure at Tyler Entrance

Nothing is more important than providing a safe, secure and high-quality learning environment for our students. The interior doors to the school will lock at 8 am so all visitors and students entering the building after 8 am will need to enter through the main office. Students who are late will proceed through the office to pupil services. All visitors who come to our school and who have the opportunity to interact with students will be required to sign in using the Hall Pass system each time they visit the school from 7:30am to 3:30pm. **Please bring a driver's license or government-issued ID** when visiting the building. The Hall Pass system quickly scans it and performs an instant screening for sex offenders. Visitors will receive a custom-printed photo ID badge that they are required to wear while they are in the building.

Chronic Absences

Attendance is crucial for the success of your student. An absence issue that tends to go unnoticed is what we refer to as "***Chronically Absent***". Excused and Unexcused absences are calculated for chronically absent. We have two fewer weeks of instructional time this year, so it is crucial that your child does not miss over 9 days for the entire year.

Truancy only takes into account the unexcused absences. Nevertheless, absences, whether excused or unexcused, will eventually have a negative impact. We want you to be informed and assist your student with being on time and regularly attending school, so that we can provide the best educational experience possible.

Our percentage of chronically absent students was 28.8% last year, (2016-2017). Our goal is to lower our chronically absent numbers by at least 5% for the 2017-18 school year.

Tardy Policy

The Northwest tardy policy has drastically reduced the number of tardies. We continue to see a decrease in tardies from year to year. This may be due—in part—to the implementation of our tardy sweeps each class period, but is also a result of our parents partnering with us to make sure an important life skill is learned. The trend shows that as the school year progresses, more and more students will start coming to school or class late. Each student gets four free tardy passes at school per semester for emergencies. Once they pass the fourth tardy, students are given detentions which eventually can lead to other consequences. Please help us by reminding your students that attendance and getting to class on time is important so they don't get behind and don't disrupt the class that is already in session.

Northwest High School utilizes the Parchment Transcript Electronic System to deliver transcripts electronically to community colleges, colleges and universities. To utilize Parchment, the student must create an account at www.parchment.com. From there, the student will be able to request that his/her transcript be sent to the school of his/her choice. Please allow 24 hours for the request to be processed. Make sure you use your student's LEGAL NAME in order to process transcripts.

Paper transcripts will only be printed for scholarship applications.
