<u>Elementary Gifted and Talented Screening</u>--Katy ISD students in grades 1-4 can be referred for screening for the 2018-2019 gifted and talented program. Parents must complete a Parent Checklist which can be obtained from the student's school or from the <u>Katy ISD website</u>.

The deadline for completing and returning the Parent Checklist is **December 6, 2017**. Checklists which are not returned by the deadline will not be screened for service for the 2018-2019 school year. The State of Texas requires that various types of measures be used to identify students for gifted programs which includes observations and standardized tests. The program for elementary students consists of a one-day pullout in the Challenge classroom with a teacher trained in gifted education.

From the Counselor

This month our Core Value is **GENEROSITY**. Please help us kick-off this Core Essential trait by wearing GREEN on Wednesday December 6, 2017. I love this quote by John Wesley because it shows the idea of being generous in our own way: "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." Below are some great activities that you can do with your family so that we can SAY, KNOW, SEE and BE what it means to be generous!

SAY IT: Generosity is making someone's day by giving something away.

KNOW IT:

<u>Ask a kid:</u>

- Has someone ever unexpectedly given something to you that you really wanted?
- What is one way you can be generous to a classmate?
- What is one way you can be generous to a stranger?

<u>Ask a grown up:</u>

• Who are some people who have helped you the most in your life? How have you shown them gratitude over the years?

• What are specific ways you have shown gratitude to people other than simply telling them thank you?

SEE IT: Visit your local library and check out the book *The Giving Tree* by Shel Silverstein or search https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xODAQbu6bJ0 to listen to a reading of the story. Read this book with your family and brainstorm ideas of ways to be generous with one another. Extend the lesson by taking opportunities to serve in your community (soup kitchens, community thrift stores, etc.). Watch your children's joyful expression as they give their time and talents to those in need.

BE IT: One night this month when you are driving through somewhere picking up dinner with your family, pay for the car behind you as well. This small act of generosity will spur on a movement and is sure to resonate with your family. Be sure to stress anonymous giving (receiving no recognition) to your children as this is an important piece of being generous.

Home to School Connection

Know your library

The local library is a great place for your child to discover books she will treasure, find information for school projects, or simply settle in and read. Help her establish a library habit with these ideas.

Get a card. Have your youngster sign up for her own library card. This will make her feel like she belongs at "her" library.

Become acquainted. Explore different sections of the library together. Encourage her to get to



know the librarians—they will recommend titles or help her locate resources.

Return books on time. Fines can add up and keep your family from checking out more books. Suggest that

your child decorate a reusable bag to hold books and add a sticky note with the due date. Each time she checks out books, she could replace the note with a new one—and a new due date.♥
