

Texting at School: Students are able to use technology devices at school for instruction only and within teacher defined parameters. We have recently had a number of parents texting their student and students texting parents during the school day. If students use technology outside of instruction, technology privileges will be taken away from a student. This includes smart watches and other devices. A student without technology privileges will still be able to use school provided devices on a rotational basis as needed for instruction. Students who have lost technology privileges can bring devices to school but those devices have to remain off and in their backpacks during the school day.
