From Mrs. Flores, School Counselor:

This Week's Character Challenge: Respect others! Respect their feelings and their things.

Did you know that research conducted by Angela Duckworth found that Grit (something directly related to perseverance) is a higher indicator of success than SAT scores, IQ, or GPA? Perseverance is our next character trait that will be highlighted for the month of December and something that is an important component of student success. Please help us kick off our next character trait, Perseverance, by <u>wearing green on Wednesday, December 4th</u>. This month students will be having conversations and activities that help develop and apply perseverance in their daily lives! We are using this definition at school: **Perseverance-** the ability to work through situations even when there are obstacles or challenges in the way. Students encounter daily obstacles each and every day and how we persevere through these obstacles allow us to grow as individuals so that we can prevail in difficult situations. From Nurse Osbourne:

We would love for all students to attend school every day. However, we know sometimes kids get sick. We have had a sharp increase in contagious illness and clinic visits in the past weeks.

Please remember, Katy ISD has a 24-hour rule.

Fever (100.0 or above), contagious illness like strep, diarrhea, or vomiting? Your child must be 24 hours free of the above symptoms without medication before returning to school. A doctor's note does NOT override this rule.

If your child has any of the symptoms listed above, please call in your child's absence at 281-234-4300.

Please also let the nurse know if your student is diagnosed with contagious illness such as flu, strep, or pink eye. Nurse Osbourne can be reached at 281-234-4325

A student can be sick without a fever, vomiting, or diarrhea. If your child has very frequent cough with thick yellow or green mucus, wheezing, crusty or pus-like discharge from the eye, or rash of unknown origin, we recommend a sick day and sometimes require doctor release, with treatment, to be in school.
