FAQ: Senior Banners

We are on the final stretch for senior year. Orders for your Senior Banners will be accepted through March 12. All payments, quotes, and pictures for your student's banner are due at this time. Don't miss out on the chance to recognize your child.

Listed below are some Frequently Asked Questions about the banners. Please feel free to contact me with any additional questions you may have.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. What are the differences between the banners?

A. There are two sizes of banners:

Small—2'x3', includes a salutation (Example: Love, Mom & Dad).

Large—2'x6', includes a salutation & a quote/message up to 100 characters, & a picture of your student.

Q. How much do the banners cost?

A. Small--\$40

Large--\$75

Q. Can I get more than one banner?

A. There is no limit to the number of banners you can purchase. You may want to let out of town relatives know about the banners. They may want to order one as well.

Q. Can friends order banners?

A. Yes, banners can be ordered by family and friends.

Q. How are banners displayed?

A. The banners will be placed around the hallways of the school during the middle of April. They will be taken down and returned to the student at cap and gown pick up.

Q. What can I do with the banner when my student brings it home?

A. The banners can be displayed inside or outside of your home to celebrate your graduate. Families use them as a party decoration and display them the week of graduation to honor their child's accomplishment.

Q. Can I put a message/quote on the 2'x3' banner?

A. You can add "Love, Mom & Dad" (plus other family members such as brothers &/or sisters) to these banners.

Q. How long can the message/quote be for the 2'x6' banner?

A. Your message/quote on the large banner can be up to 100 characters. This does not include the salutation. All banners have your student's name and "Congratulations". Keep this in mind when submitting your message/quote.

Q. What happens if my message/quote is the same as one on another banner?

A. This happens every year. It's not a problem. If you're trying to avoid this, you may want to stay away from Dr. Seuss and Winnie the Pooh quotes!!

Q. What photo can I submit for the large banner:

A. The photo you select of your student <u>must</u> be in compliance with the student dress code. The picture can be from your favorite vacation, your favorite picture from a previous school year, sports picture, or senior portrait.

The photo must be a high resolution in order to maintain the photo quality. For best results, scan an 8x10 photo at 300 dpi or get the original digital file from the photographer. Please don't send a proof or screen shot as

Q. How do I submit the banner picture?

A. Scan and email the photo you choose to gshsseniorbanners@gmail.com

Q. When is the deadline for ordering banners?

A. The last day we will be accepting orders is Friday, March 12, 2021.



about what you would like to do after graduation, but you will have a better idea of your post-graduation plans if you consider your options early. For example, do you want to attend a trade or vocational school? Do you want to study at a university? Do you want to take a gap year before studying at a university? Do you want to enter the work force immediately? Do you want to join the military? Thinking about your interests and strengths will build your vision for post-graduation plans.

Research universities you are interested in.

If you are interested in attending a university after high school, now is a good time to begin thinking about where you would like to go or what you would like to study. If there is a certain university you're considering: tour the campus, research the programs and majors offered, connect with current students or alumni, and take classes that will best prepare you for your field. Visit the university's website for information about what they offer and how to get connected, like through an email list or oncampus tours.

Get involved!



Steinbrenner offers dozens of clubs and athletic teams to help you pursue your interests, meet new friends, and contribute to the

community. If you enjoy a particular activity, reach out to others and get involved with a club or team! These are great ways to connect with people and build a network of students with common interests. CHOOSING A UNIVERSITY By Nicole Fink




