# Principal's Message

Enrollment throughout the district will run from July 30th through August 1st. The more you complete online at home prior to coming in, the faster the enrollment process will be. #### NORTHWEST TRANSCRIPT REQUEST PROCEDURE

Northwest High School utilizes the Parchment Transcript Electronic System to deliver transcripts electronically to community colleges, colleges and universities. To utilize Parchment, the student must create an account at <a href="www.parchment.com">www.parchment.com</a>. From there, the student will be able to request that his/her transcript be sent to the school of his/her choice. Please allow 24 hours for the request to be processed. Make sure you use your student's LEGAL NAME in order to process transcripts.

Paper transcripts will only be printed for scholarship applications.

There are only 2 ACT dates left this year. If you are a junior and haven't taken the ACT yet, please review these dates and see if one would work for you.

#### LEARNING CENTER INFORMATION

#### SUMMER LEARNING CENTER @ NORTHWEST

Dates and times: May 18th – June 14th, 7:30 AM – 4:00 PM (excluding May 28 and June 8) Cost for a .5 credit course in the Learning Center is \$90.00.

All 9<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> grade students taking learning center in the summer will need to have their class completed by June 14th. If not completed student will be required to pay for course again and start over. **The Summer Learning Center calendar availability is attached.**

#### SENIOR NEWS

Seniors need to keep in mind that failing a class required for graduation during the second semester will mean that they will NOT be able to participate in the graduation exercises on May 15th. Teachers have said over and over again that poor attendance is the cause of most failed courses. The solution is quite simple: ATTEND CLASS!!! Parents are urged to become very active in their student's high school career. Parent involvement and parent expectations have strong relationships to high student achievement. Your student may be 18 years of age, but that does not automatically give them the maturity required to see the importance of attending each and every class and completing the required work.

In the event that your senior does fail a course second semester, Summer School and Learning Center will be available for make-up credit. Although participation in graduation exercises will not be possible, a diploma can still be earned. The high school diploma is still the ticket to a successful future. #### MAKING UP CREDITS

There are several options for students who need to make up credits for graduation. If your student is an underclassman, please encourage him/her to make up the course in summer school. Summer school will be held at East High School from May 29th through June 14th.

Learning Center is another alternative for students to make-up credits. Learning Center courses are computer based and students must pass courses at 70% or higher to earn credit. Courses currently being taken in the Learning Center must be completed by May 7th for any senior planning to graduate on May 15th. #### **WICHITA SUMMER SCHOOL 2018**

Summer School will run from May 29th – June 14th at East High School (2301 E. Douglas)

- First semester courses are offered in the morning session: 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.
- Second semester courses are offered in the afternoon session: 12:00 to 4:00 p.m.

The cost per class (.5 credit course) is \$90.00 for in district and \$150.00 for out of district students. Summer school is a great opportunity for students to make up classes they have failed during the school year.

The only classes that can be taken for original credit are:

- PE Foundations for students entering their freshman year (must pay at East High)
- Government for students entering their senior year.
- Financial Literacy for students entering their junior year.

<u>Enrollment and payment for Summer School is April 9th -May 23rd</u>; see your grade level Guidance Counselor for enrollment information. The Summer School Application and Summer School Brochure is attached.

# AP/Honors Study Hall

Northwest is excited to offer a new class in 2018-19 to support students who are taking advanced coursework. This class will be an elective study hall where students get time to work on Advanced Placement and/or honors coursework during the school day. Students should talk to their grade level counselor about enrolling in this class.

#### **Student Criteria:**

- Students must be juniors or seniors in good academic standing and on-track to graduate with their class.
- Students should have a minimum of 3 honors and/or Advanced Placement courses.
- Students cannot drop the study hall at semester (including seniors).
- Students must show motivation & interest in using time at school in a structured environment in order. to complete the rigorous reading and writing requirements for honors and AP courses at NWHS.
- Students must commit to using the class time to work on assignments for AP and honors courses.

# **Mathematics Summer Assignment**
