## Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

For those families who have been with us since we began, or if you have spoken to me about State Accountability and the STAAR test, you may know that I do not believe the success of a student nor a school can be measured by one day on one test. I also do not believe in stressing kids out by hanging the STAAR test over their heads like a scary monster. Staff members know my expectation that they not even specifically talk about the STAAR test or "THE test" until about 2 weeks out from STAAR testing, where time is taken to specifically review concepts and hone test-taking skills. It is my belief that if our staff teach the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), build solid relationships with students founded in Kindness and Care, communicate with parents, and follow campus goals, we will do fine on state testing. On that note, I am happy to let you know our staff and students worked hard together to build relationships and focus on common goals last year, which led to our campus earning a letter grade of "A" from the Texas Education Agency (TEA) with a distinction in "Top 25 Percent: Comparative Closing the Gaps," in which we scored 100%. Based on data and input from staff and parents, we have defined and refined goals for this school year. I will talk about these goals over the next few weeks in my weekly message.

**Lunch Visitors:** We are now open for lunch visitors! Please remember that you can visit your student once per week.

<u>Grandparent's Week:</u> We invite Grandparents to have lunch with their grandchildren one time next week. It is imperative that grandparents be listed on the Katy ISD Lunch Visitor Form sent home in the 1st Day Envelope. If they are not listed, they will not be able to visit their grandchild. This is a safety measure for your child's protection. Each Grandparent will also need a valid state identification card/driver's license/passport. We look forward to meeting grandparents next week!

**Notice:** We are unable to heat students' lunches. When packing a lunch please ensure you are packing items that do not need heating, refrigeration, etc.

**Reminder:** Please remember students are not permitted to bring nut products for classroom snacks. We are unable to separate students and control eating environments in the classroom like we can at lunch. In the lunchroom we have allergy seating which separates students who have documented allergies from students who bring food from home.

Paws for Kindness: This year our PTA's major fundraiser will be called Paws for Kindness. Our PTA is doing all the work, which means a very large portion of the funds raised (90%) will be used here at Bryant and not paid to a company who puts on a production, provides the giveaways and plans the final event.
