### Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

**Crossing Guard:** We are in need of a Crossing Guard at the front of the school. If interested, please call or email. Until we have a new Crossing Guard hired and trained, we will have staff walking kids across the front crosswalk from 7:55-8:20 and 3:30-3:45pm. Traffic direction will not be given. As motorists, please follow all posted signs, and follow all rules and laws printed in the current <u>Texas Driver Handbook</u> when entering and exiting the campus.

**Playground:** We have been experiencing a lot of wet weather this school year which has made our playground very muddy and have areas of standing water. Through a parent suggestion via the weekly survey, we will implement the following: on weather permitting days when the playground is muddy, students will still receive outdoor time. K-1 will play on the hard top and 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> will use the empty car rider lane to walk a large lap around the campus. Physical movement is important during the day so we are happy to implement this new plan. On a side note, I have met with the Executive Director of Maintenance to show him our playground concerns. We are on the list to have the playground drainage improved as well as the area regraded. There is no timeline on completion but we are on the wait list, which is good.

**Satisfaction Surveys:** Please know that I read each and every suggestion submitted through our Weekly Satisfaction Survey. We have received some really good ideas which we have been able to act upon. The recess lap idea came from a suggestion. We are also in line to receive outdoor intercom speakers on the east side of the building (and this has been adopted in future iterations of our floor plan). More detailed grade level newsletters was also given as feedback which we have acted upon. While not every suggestion is able to be acted upon immediately, please know they are considered. I really appreciate those of you who leave contact information so that I can follow

up with you. While it is often easy to only complete a survey when we are upset about something, the positives really help...especially staff shout outs. All staff praise is written into the weekly Staff Newsletter for employees to read as well as displayed on our Kindness Windows in the main hallway. Thanks to everyone who takes time to complete our survey. An end of year survey will be sent out towards the end of the year to gather more in-depth feedback.

**Bikes/Scooters:** Students who ride bikes/scooters to school need to use a lock in order to secure property. Without a lock, all bikes/scooters are left "at your own risk."

**Friendship Parties:** Friendship Parties will be held tomorrow. The party times are as follows: <u>10:30-11:15</u>-- 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Grades; <u>11:45-12:30</u>-- Kindergarten & 4<sup>th</sup> Grade; <u>12:00-12:45-</u>- 1<sup>st</sup> Grade; <u>2:00-2:45-</u>- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade. <u>Please note-</u> in order to stay within building capacity and remain aligned to Fire Marshall standards, there is a limit of 2 adults per student during parties. We use the following guidelines for party visitors: Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s), Grandparents listed on the Lunch Visitor Form completed in the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of School Packet, and aunts/uncles who are <u>accompanied</u> by a parent/guardian. We encourage all students to stay at school after their party as the remainder of the day is instructional and a regular school day. Students leaving early do receive a partial day absence. At this time, if you did not take advantage of the Pre-Raptor option, you will need to be raptored at the front desk. Please plan for extended wait times. <u>\*\*Also note</u>, only guardians may check a student out after a party. If a grandparent is checking a student out, we will need a note sent to the school the morning of the party giving us permission for release.

**Friendship Cards:** Friendship cards may be distributed on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February. Teachers will instruct students to not open any candy that may be attached as part of friendship cards. These cards will be placed in a bag or box and delivered home for students to enjoy. If you would like for your child to not participate, please notify your child's teacher and he/she will be given an alternate activity.

Please note, after-school programs are not affiliated with Bryant or Katy ISD. These vendors rent space in the building in order to offer their program. #### **Adventures by mail**

Your child can explore the world without leaving home! This activity turns him into a "flat traveler" like Flat Stanley in the

could write questions that will help him learn about the place, perhaps about the weather, language, foods, geography, or landmarks.
