It is hard to believe that it is already the end of September. We hope everyone is having a productive week.

A district-wide communication was sent out on September 25, 2017, but I wanted to make sure everyone read that four of the previously designated early release days (Oct. 9, 20, Feb 16, April 13) will be extended to full instructional days. October 9th and 20th had been set aside for parent/teacher conferences at Bryant. However, in lieu of the in-person conferences, parents are encouraged to communicate with teachers by email and/or phone. Parents should also continue to monitor their student's progress on the <u>Home Access Center</u>. Friday, December 15 and Thursday, May 24 will remain "early release" days. If you feel you need to have a parent conference during the school year, please request one with your teacher.

Please Note: Tardies will go into effect October 2nd. If you arrive after the 8:20 bell, you will need to walk your student in and check them in to school.

Reminder: Please remember that lunch visitors should not include aunts, uncles, friends, or neighbors. Also, as outlined in the Student/Parent handbook which went home at the beginning of the year, lunch visits are limited to once per week. If you have an extenuating circumstance throughout the year, please email me for approval.

<u>Reminder</u>: State law prohibits the use of cell phones while in a school zone. This includes while in our car rider line. We have already had some near misses. Please stay off your devices while moving in the car rider line.

For the month of October, our Core Value is **CREATIVITY**. We will kick off the Value by wearing tie dye on Wednesday October 4th. Henry David Thoreau said, "The world is but a canvas to the imagination." This month we will focus on fostering creativity so that our students can dream and imagine. Below are some great activities that you can do with your family so that we can SAY, KNOW, SEE and BE what it means to be creative!

SAY IT: Creativity is using your imagination to do something unique.

KNOW IT:

Ask a kid:

- Have you ever made up a game to play with friends or by yourself?
- Share ideas, dreams or thoughts you have had about something that you have created or want to create.

Ask a grown up:

• What does it mean to think outside the box?

• When are you at your most creative? Are you most creative when you are in a crowd, alone, busy, bored, happy, sad, etc.? Share your experiences.

SEE IT: The Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) in Manhattan, New York displays some of the most creative works of art in the world. Art is not just paintings or sculptures, but can also be movies, songs, architecture, photos and books. BE IT: Research your area for opportunities to get your family involved in creative endeavors. Ideas include painting classes, pottery classes, and culinary classes. Participating as a family in these classes will give you an opportunity to exercise your creative potential and the opportunity to appreciate everyone's imagination.

My school-year memory book

Encourage your youngster to create a personalized memory book this school year. It will give him a place to save schoolwork he's proud of and provide a nice keepsake for both of you.

I. To make the front and back covers, have him cut off the large panels of a cereal box and cover them with construction paper.



2. Let him write his name, the year, his school, and his teacher's name on the front. He can decorate both panels with stickers or drawings.

3. Hole-punch the covers, thread yarn through, and tie loosely so it's easy to untie and add pages.
