This is Ms. Horner's 19th year teaching. She has taught Pre-K, 2nd, 4th, and 5th grade. Ms. Horner grew up in a family of educators and knew from an early age that she wanted to become a teacher. She loves to see the world through the different perspectives of her students. Ms. Horner said the best part of her job is watching her students grow and achieve goals. Ms. Horner shared one of her favorite moments in education, "Seeing a previous student years later and being able to see what they have accomplished is a favorite moment for me. I was

recently contacted by a student I taught 16 years ago in 2nd grade. He has become a successful lawyer and told me that I was always his favorite teacher." Outside of school, since both her children play soccer, you can usually find Ms. Horner on the soccer fields cheering! She also loves all genres of music and loves reading a good book. Ms. Horner shared how she helps create a culture of care and kindness at Bryant, "The best way to promote kindness and caring behaviors in my classroom is to model them. I love our Community Circle time each day where we can share and grow with each other. I strive for my <u>classroom</u> to be a loving, caring environment where students want to be." Last week I provided you with a Katy ISD Curriculum resource which shows videos of conceptual math being taught. This week I would like to introduce you to <u>https://math4texas.org</u>. This is an amazing resource for parents to see what content is covered in each grade level and how the concepts grow from year to year. Once you go to the homepage, look to the top right and you will see "For Parents." Hover above this and grade levels will appear. Click on the grade level of your choice. The big ideas and topics for the grade level will be described. On the left panel, choose a specific topic and click. That topic will then expand into subtopics. Click on the Subtopic and you will be given tips, examples, interactive games and other resources you can use for your own knowledge or to help your student. I just found out about this resource and wanted to share right away.

Our campus-wide focus for writing in November and December is organization and structure. To write so our readers can understand, our writing needs to follow a structure, or organizational pattern. Think of this like the bones in our bodies. If we didn't have bones, we would just be blobs. Our structure holds us up and allows us to move in different ways. In writing, structure not only depends on the genre, but it includes how we begin our pieces (leads, introductions, hooks), how we develop the middle, and how we close our piece (endings, conclusions, reflections). When we organize our writing into a structure, our readers are able to follow along and make meaning from it. This focus will be a big one, and we look forward to watching our writers thrive when writing with organization and structure!

Home to School Connection

"I love to learn"

Children devote more energy to learning when they're motivated. These ideas will boost your youngster's thirst for knowledge.

Show enthusiasm. Tell your child what *you* learn. ("I found out that about 90 percent of the world's population lives in the Northern Hemisphere!") Also, ask him to teach you information he learns in school. If he's studying nocturnal animals, he might explain to you why his hamster runs on its wheel at night. He'll see learning as an



everyday activity for kids *and* grown-ups, and your attitude will be contagious.

Inspire curiosity. Express interest when your youngster poses questions. If he asks why we get the hiccups or whether owls really are wise, you could say, "That's a good question! Let's find out together." Then, help him look up the topic in a library book or online. When you discover the answer, encourage him to share it with friends or relatives so they can learn more, too.♥
