Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

Last week, we discussed our Wildly Important Goal of Writing Improvement and how we are establishing consistent vocabulary and writing processes this school year.

Our next Wildly Important Goal (WIG) is Parent *Engagement*. We love having our parents involved in their child's education but we want to do more; we want parents to be *engaged*. Many think these two words, involved and engaged, are interchangeable, but they are actually quite different. Parent involvement includes coming to events, conferences, concerts, and other activities but engagement is the building of a partnership.

Larry Ferlazzo (ASCD, 2011) more accurately describes the difference between involvement and engagement. He states, *A school striving for family involvement often leads with its mouth—identifying projects, needs, and goals and then telling parents how they can contribute. A school striving for parent engagement, on the other hand, tends to lead with its ears—listening to what parents think, dream, and worry about. The goal of family engagement is not to serve clients but to gain partners.*

Our third WIG is one of the most important because it involves creating a true partnership between home and school. When this is truly accomplished with each family, the possibilities for each child become endless.

Over the next couple of weeks I will discuss ways that we plan to engage with you in order to build a solid partnership.

Gifted and Talented Screening for Current Fifth Grade Students

Students in fifth grade **who are not currently identified** for the elementary Challenge program have the opportunity to be screened for Gifted and Talented Program with service to begin in the fall of sixth grade. Secondary gifted program options are available in English, reading, mathematics, science, and social studies. Students may be screened in any or all of these content areas.

Letters to 5th Grade Parents have been sent home. Parents interested in referring their child for secondary Gifted and Talented screening need to complete a Secondary Parent Checklist and return to the elementary campus by September 20.

Screening will occur during the months of October through December. Parents will be notified of the placement decision by U.S. mail in January.

Please make sure you are completing the checklist for Secondary screening and not the Elementary form.
