#### Staff Spotlight—Ms. Amanda McKinley

Ms. McKinley contributes to the Culture of Care and Kindness at Bryant by helping her students learn the importance of listening when someone else is talking as well as respecting other people's opinions.

#### Dr. Rhodes' Weekly Message

This week, we will begin discussing our Wildly Important Goals (WIGs) for the school year. We have three WIGs this school year and in this edition of the Bryant Bulletin we will discuss our first goal, Student Growth. At Bryant, it is our goal and job to ensure each and every student grows by at least one full school year or more by the end of each school year. This may seem like a given, as students move up a grade level each year, but it is actually quite challenging. Since every student enters a grade level at a different "spot" in their learning, the most important aspect is for teachers to get to know and understand what students already know and determine a pathway for their learning. Continuous growth occurs when we do not focus on teaching all students the same thing in the same way, but teaching students overarching skills and then tailoring those skills to individual student need—practice with on-level materials, filling in gaps that students may have with the skill, or pushing students further who already know the skill. It is important to teach our students through the lens of a growth mindset; always pushing forward, setting goals, and growing in new ways.

Some specific ways we ensure a year or more of growth for each student is through goal setting. Like last year, students will begin to set academic goals. Students in all grade levels will use data to track their progress with their teacher. The goal is for students to learn the basics of how to set goals, how to measure success and what to do if we don't quite meet our goals, and what to do next if we meet or exceed our goals. This looks very different in Kindergarten than it will in 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Through the goal setting process, teachers will know their students even better, students will become more invested in their learning because they are intrinsically motivated to reach their goals, and overall, this will help each teacher to help grow each student by one or more years. We began implementing goal setting last school year and are refining our skills. Our STAAR results indicated that 100% of students who had gaps in learning the previous year, had a majority of the gaps filled the next year (last year). We will continue fine tuning remediation; however, we are also focusing on how to grow students who are already above grade level even further in their learning. We are tasked to grow ALL students and while we have to fill in any gaps in learning, we simultaneously have to grow students who are on level or above level.

Needless to say, teaching is no small feat these days; it is very different than when you are I were in school. Today's classroom teacher has to be very skilled to ensure every student receives what they need in order to grow as a learner.

In next week's Bryant Bulletin, we will discuss other ways teachers and students will focus on Student Growth for the 19/20 school year.

**Birthday Information:** Due to privacy, our school does not publish any type of formal directory of student information. As a Katy ISD school, we do not allow students to hand out birthday invitations at school. Since some parents would like to provide their child's information to other grade-level parents for birthday or other invitations, we have created a method for your information to be released to other grade-level parents if you opt-in.

In order to facilitate this, a Google Form has been created for each grade level. If you would like to share your information and your child(ren)'s information, you can fill out the information requested at each grade level link. This is completely voluntary. The links will be live through September 17<sup>th</sup>. After the 17<sup>th</sup>, the compiled information for each grade will be emailed to everyone who has chosen to participate. Information provided will not be considered private and would be open to any public information requests community members may make through Katy ISD as governed by Texas Government Code 552 (the Texas Public Information Act) and 20 U.S.C. 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99 (the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, or FERPA)

The information will be shared only with parents who also provide their student's information. However, parents could share information with others, etc. Again, this is completely optional and voluntary. Click on the grade level to complete the form:

**Gifted and Talented Screening for Current Fifth Grade Students:** Students in fifth grade <u>who are not currently</u> <u>identified</u> for the elementary Challenge program have the opportunity to be screened for the Gifted and Talented Program with service to begin in the fall of sixth grade. Secondary gifted program options are available in English, reading, mathematics, science, and social studies. Students may be screened in any or all of these content areas. Letters to 5th Grade Parents have been sent home. Parents interested in referring their child for secondary Gifted and Talented screening need to complete a Secondary Parent Checklist and return to the elementary campus by September 19, 2019.

Screening will occur during the months of October through December. Parents will be notified of the placement decision by U.S. mail in January.
