

This Week's Character Challenge: Get to know someone that you don't know very well.

Today, we kicked off the month of October by highlighting our next character trait: Empathy. So, this month we are having conversations and experiences to help us develop the social-emotional skill of Empathy! We are using this definition at school:

Empathy: the ability to understand and connect to the feelings of another.

Empathy is an important skill for creating connected and kind communities. Students will be understanding the meaning of empathy and how to practice it in their everyday lives through engaging activities and powerful discussions. From our Math/Science Instructional Coach:

Marvelous Math: Reading bedtime stories to children has been a cherished activity for years. We want our little readers to love books and see the value in reading! Don't we want the same for our little mathematicians?? Of course, we do! Math Before Bed is a collection of visual prompts that allow you to discuss math topics with your children before bed, at the dinner table, or really anywhere you have access to the prompts! I think you will notice, like we do in our Bryant math classrooms, that students come up with the most amazing math ideas that sometimes we adults miss! We learn from them every day! Try these out and see what you and your whole family can learn from each other...and start spreading a love for math!

Spotlight on Science: Check out the night sky in the month of October to see if you can spot Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn! Click here for help. You can also download a moon phases recording sheet for the month here. Students as early as Kindergarten observe, describe, and illustrate objects in the sky as part of the Texas science curriculum. By 4th and 5th grade, students are expected to collect and analyze data to identify sequences of change in the observable appearance of the moon over time. Observe these amazing phenomena together as a family!
